It is our pleasure and honour to welcome all 23 participating players and officials to our 4th MCKK Rugby Premier 7s tournament. How time flies. It wasn't that long ago when we had our first tournament. In our inaugural tournament, our closest ally, Vajiravudh College Bangkok was the only foreign participating team. This year we are excited to welcome six foreign teams. The local folks in Kuala Kangsar and those in the rugby fraternity are equally excited to see how school teams from some world rugby powerhouse nations perform. Ultimately, local teams stand to gain, for they will get the chance, courtesy of MCKK as the host, to play against these more established teams.

Hopefully this fourth edition will be the grandest thus far, and credit goes to the diligent organizing committee, the generous sponsors, the supportive local authorities. We are also grateful for the blessing of the Perak Royal household.

Most players who have played rugby will testify that there is no better team sport that can generate good values that are most beneficial after these young boys leave school. Some will be lucky enough to be able to play at tertiary level and beyond, while others will have to hang their boots in the face of life struggles.

In life we, rugby players included, have idols who we look up to. When asked to name their idols, MCKK rugby boys listed present and past rugby greats from a particular nation. Their selections are obvious, based on current on-field performance alone. I asked if they ever knew any great rugby player who also has a great career outside the game after retirement. Again obviously they did

not look that far. I asked if anyone of them has heard of an Argentinian by the name of Filipe Contepomi. I received blank looks.

Dr Filipe Contepomi retired from the international scene only last October, after winning a record 87 caps for the Pumas over 15 years, including appearing in four World Cups. His 651 points contribution is also another Argentinian record. 2007 can be considered his best year in rugby. He was Los Pumas key player that sealed third place at the World Cup. He won the Ireland Player of the Year Award, for his success with Dublin's Leinster club, the 2007 European Club champion. At the world stage, he came second behind Bryan Habana for the coveted 2007 International Player of the Year award. But most significantly, was the medical degree that he obtained from the prestigious Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland in that same year. How he managed to juggle time between the demands of medical studies and the strenuous rugby training and competing at the highest level is something to be marveled at.

There have been others of course. Those who spring to mind are Welsh Dr JPR Williams, English businessmen Steve Smith and Fran Cotton, and South African Dr Jannie du Plessis. We don't have to look very far really. Several successful Malaysian corporate figures were once top rugby players during their schooldays.

Today we meet in MCKK to celebrate the joy of rugby. We trained hard to achieve greatness. Equally simple, the same principle must also apply in all our other pursuits, especially our studies. Food for thought. Do enjoy the tournament.

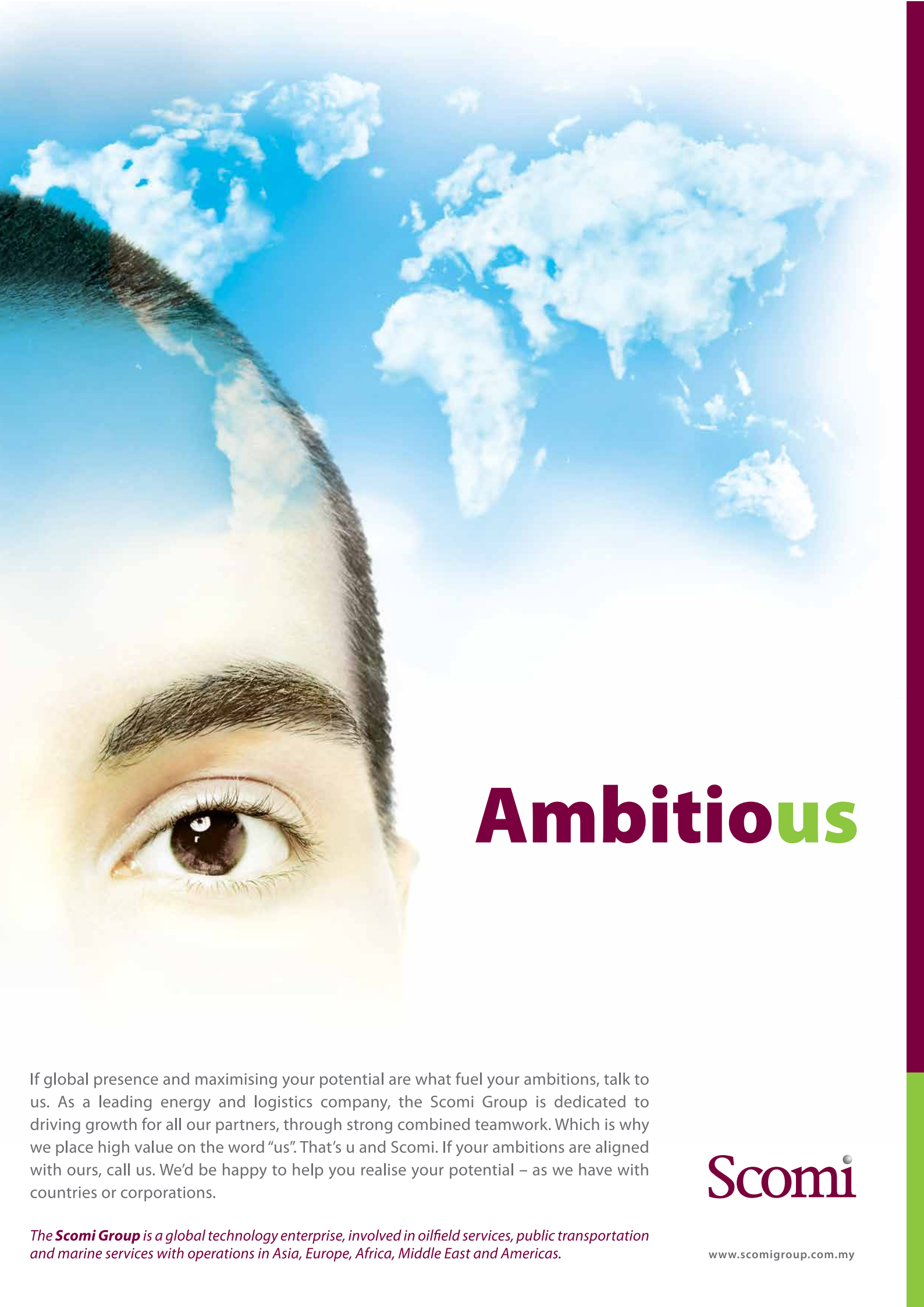

03 KUALA KANGSAR

KUALA KANGSAR TRIVIA

KUALA KANGSAR TRIVIA



1. Kuala Kangsar is a Malaysian town located at the confluence of the Kangsar River and Perak River in the state of Perak. In addition to being the name of the Town, the District in which Kuala Kangsar Town is located is also known as Kuala Kangsar - one of ten existing Districts in Perak, with a population of 176,000 in the District.

2. In the Malay language, Kuala means river mouth while the word Kangsar refers to the name of a tree, specifically the Hibiscus floccosus Mast. However, most romantics prefer to attribute the name Kuala Kangsar to the legend of the Kangsar River being the 99th tributary of the Perak River and thus its known as the "Kuala Yang Ke-Kurang Satu Dari Satu Ratus" (one hundred but one) which was shortened to "Kuala Kurang-Sa" and later became just Kuala Kangsar ... for the record, a simple count of the number of Perak River tributaries has accordingly disprove this legend.

Due to its five syllable name, the town has been popularly referred to as KK while to its inhabitants, its simply known as "Kwaler" - pronunciation of the word Kuala in the local patois.

3. With its strategic location astride the Perak River in central Perak, its relatively cool climate and its fertile land brought about by the almost annual flooding (the last of which occurred in the 1970s) of the Perak River - Kuala Kangsar (KK) became an important agricultural and commercial settlement and was in time, recognised by the Perak Sultanate as one of the key administrative centres for their governance of Perak. The British Intervention in Perak marked a watershed in the history of KK when it was formally recognised as the official capital of Perak by virtue of it being formally chosen as the Royal Town from which to Govern by the then Sultan of Perak - Sultan Idris I at the end of the 19th century. Though still presently a Royal Town, Kuala Kangsar's role as the State's capital was short lived as first Taiping and later Ipoh assumed the role of Perak's capital in tandem with the British commercial interest which is heavily influenced by wealth generated by tin mining.

4. As per other major centres of population in Malaysia, British colonisation had left major impact on KK Town and District. Foremost is the role KK had played in the creation of the Federated Malay States (FMS), the idea of which was formalised at the first Durbar held in 1897 in KK. These Durbars had also resulted in the formation of what is now known as the Majlis Raja-Raja (Conference of Rulers) - the oldest Malay Institution on record. Another initiative directly attributed to these Durbars is establishment of the Malay Residential School which is now known as The Malay College Kuala Kangsar (MCKK) - a renowned fully residential secondary school for Malay boys and, on record, the second oldest Malay Institution.

A second positive impact left by the British in Kuala Kangsar is the presence of grand engineering structures designed and / or constructed by British individuals / entities.

Examples of such structures which can still be viewed today are, amongst others :-

- Victoria Bridge, an iron bridge spanning the Perak River at Karak / Enggor, was completed and officially opened in 1900 - however, it was only fully operational as part of the Penang - Johor train services in 1910 and is presently no longer in use.
- Sultan Azlan Shah Gallery, originally known as Istana Hulu or Istana Kota, is the first concrete palace built in Perak - built in Victorian style, it was completed in 1903.
- The building formerly known as The King's Pavilion was built as the residence for the British High Commissioner to the FMS and its construction was completed in 1907 - presently used as the main building for an all girls secondary school, the Sekolah Menengah Raja Perempuan Kalsom.
- MCKK's Big School and Prep School was designed in Greco-Roman style and was fully completed in 1908 and 1913, respectively.
- Perak State's Official Mosque, Masjid Ubudiah - one of the most beautiful mosques in Malaysia, features West Asian-inspired design and completed in 1919.
- The Pavilion Tower, a three-tiered lookout tower made of wood located opposite MCKK's Big School Field, was built to facilitate viewing of sporting events and completed in 1930.
- Iskandar Bridge was completed in 1932 and is presently used as a two lane dual carriage way for motorised vehicles along the old federal trunk road a few kilometres outside of KK Town.
- Perak State's Official Royal Palace, the Istana Iskandariah - completed 1933 and is the formal residence of the Perak Sultan.
- KK Clock Tower - built to commemorate independence of Malaysia in 1957.

A third element legacy British colonial times is relating to the economy. In 1877, seven rubber tree seedlings were planted in Kuala Kangsar of which one tree is still alive and officially recognised as the oldest rubber tree in Malaysia - this is the tree located at the intersection of Jalan Raja Chulan and Jalan Tun Razak which is just down the road from the aforementioned Pavilion Tower and MCKK campus. The British presence also encouraged commerce which resulted in the construction of various pre-war shophouses in the area considered as the old town for KK.



5. In addition to the above, there are other structures of interest in KK, such as :-

- Royal Mausoleum - located besides the Ubudiah Mosque, completed circa 1916 and still in use today.
- Istana Kenangan - wooden palace located behind the Iskandariah Palace was built in traditional Perak style circa 1926 and is presently a museum.
- Sultan Abdul Jalil Bridge was completed in 2002 and links KK Town directly with the various traditional Malay Villages of Sayong.

6. Befitting its status as the Royal Town of Perak, KK has a wide variety traditional crafts located within its boundaries. The most famous craft associated with KK is the Labu Sayong - a Perak Malay traditional earthenware crafted as water pitchers from which cool water is served no matter what is the temperature of the day.

Another traditional craft based in Sayong, the group of villages located on the opposite bank from KK Town, is the Rebana - a hand held circular flat drum which, when struck by the palm of the other hand generates a deeper sound when compared to its more famous cousin - the Kompang.

A craft originally confined for the use of Perak Royalty is the Tekat - gold thread embroidery and the centre for Tekat excellence for KK is Kampong Changkat, a traditional Malay village near to the Iskandariah Palace. Popular designs are based on orchid flowers and paddy stalks and produced as, amongst others - cushion covers, hand fans, pillow cases and beddings.

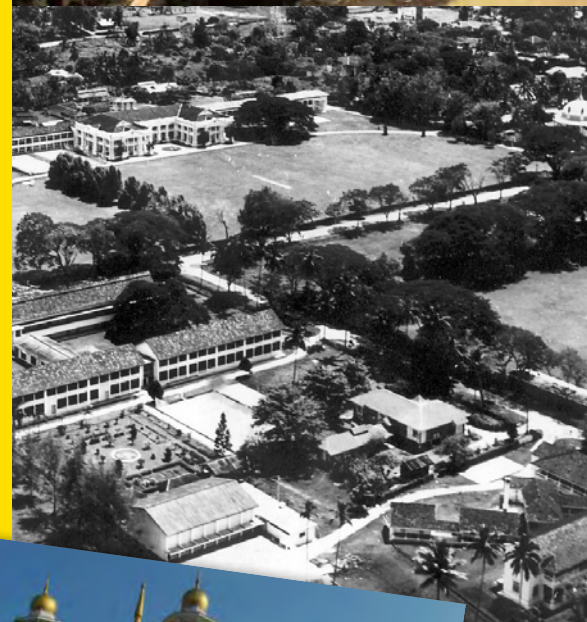
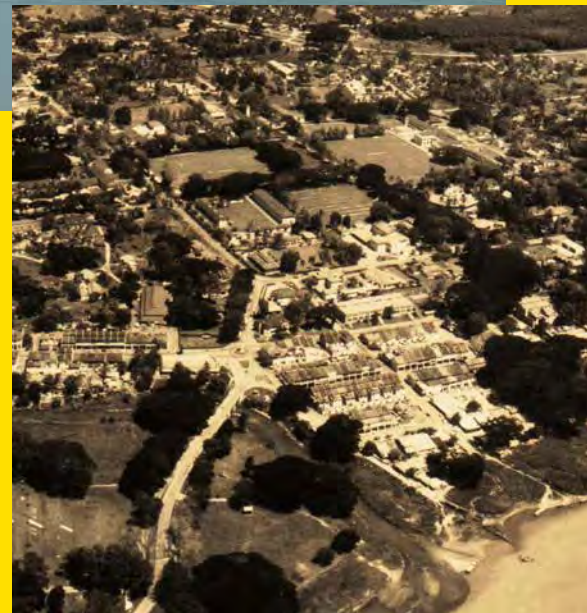
KK is also famous for its metal works where weapons, such as the traditional Malay Keris - asymmetrical Malay dagger with distinctive wavy blade, work tools, such as the golok, parang, pisau, as well as jewelries and insignias are produced.

All of the above craft products may be bought at their place of production or at craft shops / stalls located at the Lembah Bazaar (riverside @ KK Town-side) or at Persisiran Sayong (riverside @ opposite KK Town - thus can be reached either via boat service crossing the Perak River or via the Sultan Abdul Jalil Bridge).

7. KK is also well known for its Agriculture produce and its unique-tasting food products. On most weekends, its morning market (located at the Lembah area besides the Perak River opposite Pingiran Sayong) draw crowds from near and far attracted by the promise of local products such as "ikan sungai, ulam kampong, buah-buahan tempatan & kuih-muih tradisi" (riverine fish, village vegetables, local fruits and traditional cookies / finger food). Accordingly, using the above ingredients, Kuala Kangsar is famous for its traditional Malay dishes such as Gulai Ikan Darat Masak Tempoyak (riverine fish cooked in durian-based soup), grilled fish and also Laksa KK - thick rice noodles served in thin but tasty fish soup. One of the more successful KK Laksa franchise is Laksa which has its main outlet in the kampong behind the Tsung Wah Chinese Secondary School, Talang.

Reflecting KK's multi-cultural heritage, KK's Laksa is often consumed together with Chendol - dessert featuring shaved ice which also serves as a thirst quencher, albeit sweet usually sold by Indian traders. Both Laksa and Chendol are served at the Hawker Centre on the banks of the River Kangsar located at Lembah (riverside @ KK Town-side). Additionally, Laksa and/or Chendol are sold by mobile hawkers as well as at dedicated shops / hawker stalls.

There are also the traditional Chinese Hailam Coffee Shops frequented by all and sundry such as the famous Yut Loy (now known as Yat Lai) Restaurant with its famous Pau (Chinese Dumplings) and the Double Lion Restaurant for its ever tasty bread products.

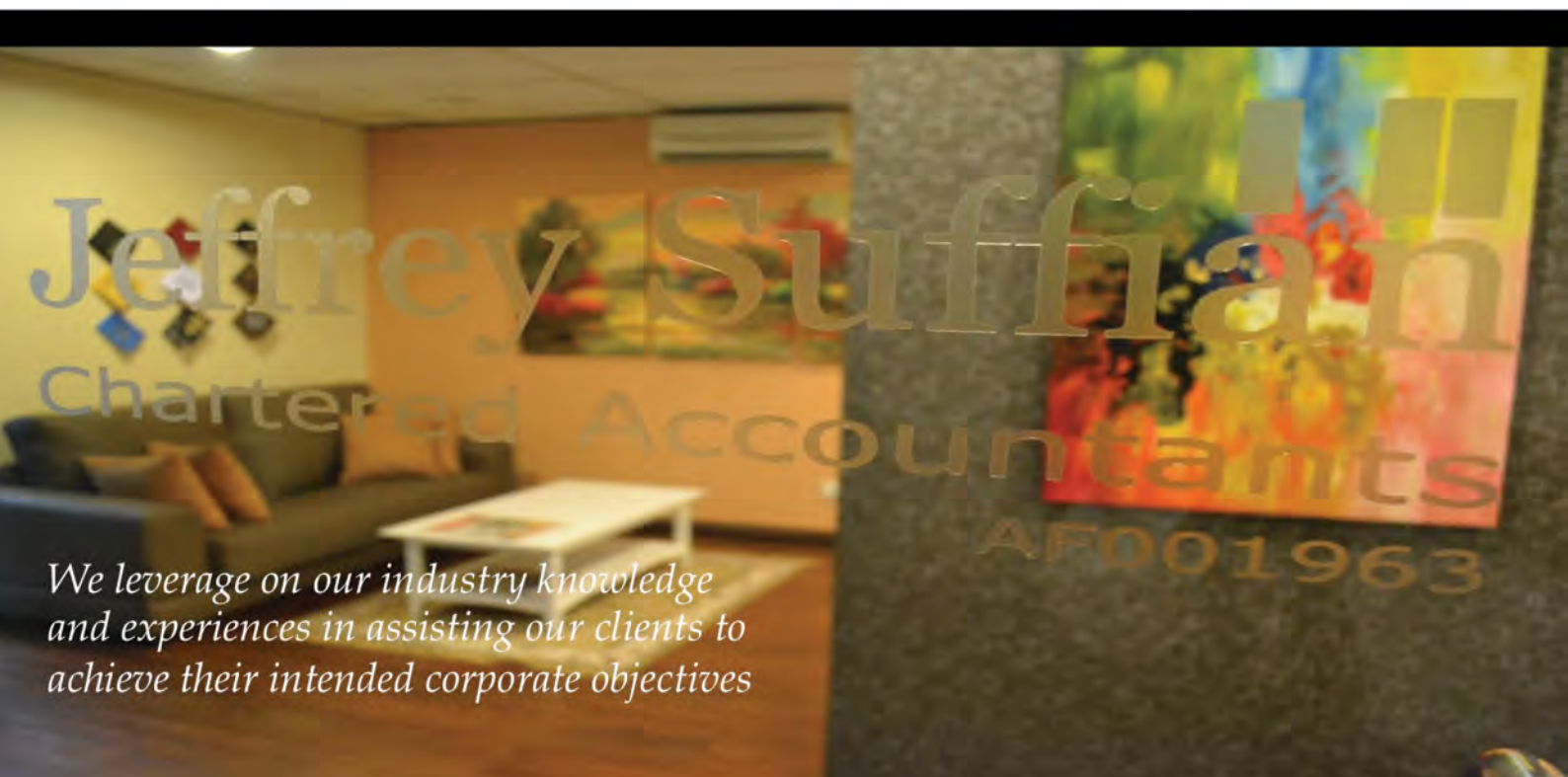

MCKK, MCOBA AND MALAYSIAN RUGBY

Rugby is a sport introduced into Malaysia by the British and the game enjoyed its hey days in the 1950s and 1960s when the game was played not only at the Schools level but also amongst expatriates as well as servicemen stationed in the then Malaya and laterly Malaysia.

As Malaysia developed as a nation, the resulting wealth and prosperity accordingly led to the containment and subsequent eradication of the communists as well as other types of security threats and this in turn negatively impacted the popularity of rugby in Malaysia as the mainstay of the rugby talent pool - namely, British, Australian and New Zealand Servicemen stationed in the country, saw their numbers progressively reduced. In the absence of these "Mat Salehs", the task of sustaining Rugby in Malaysia thus fall on the locals in the form of either Rugby Clubs as well as Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs).

One such NGO is MCOBA - The Malay College Old Boys Association. Being the Alumni Organisation for The Malay College Kuala Kangsar (MCKK) - a premier boarding school with rugby playing traditions dating back to before World War II. Amongst the MCKK Alumnus who were / are prominent personalities in Malaysian Rugby are former Malaysian Rugby Union (MRU) Presidents Tan Sri Megat Najmuddin (present MCOBA President) and Zain Yusof (present Chairman of MCOBA All Blacks Revival [ABR] Committee); former Coach of Malaysia's National Team - Shahid Majid; former Malaysia Team Manager, Nik Azmi; former Captain of Malaysia Aziz Ismail, former Captain of Malaysia U-23 Zainudin

Kamarudin and numerous others who had represented Malaysia, including personalities such as Bahari Atan, Adnan Maarof, Kamaruzzaman Maarof, Zaharudin Alias, Rozali Nordin, Din Ahmad, Abdul Fatah Rejab and Azizan Abas.

At the Club level, MCOBA has been active in the Klang Valley rugby scene since the 1960s competing in both Selangor and Kuala Lumpur Rugby Unions organised tournaments at various levels. Additionally, MCOBA has been instrumental in establishing the Inter-Alumni Rugby Tournament which now feature more than 20 Alumnis competing in the Annual Tournament.

At the Malaysian Schools level, MCKK has been one of the traditional powerhouses not only at Perak State level but also at National and International levels. Since the 1950s, MCKK has been playing Annual Rugby Game against Thailand's Vajiravudh College on "Alternate Home and Away" basis as well as matches against several other Schools from countries such as Hong Kong, Singapore and Sri Lanka, albeit on ad-hoc basis.

Since 2011, MCOBA and MCKK have jointly been organising the MCKK Premier 7s Rugby Tournament where 24 teams compete for the coveted NJ Ryan Trophy. This invitational tournament features rugby teams from schools in Malaysia as well as from schools in countries such as Thailand, Hong Kong and Brunei. The first two editions of the Tournament were won by Sekolah Sukan Tengku Mahkota Johor (SSTMJ) - Malaysia's "official" Sports School for Rugby while MCKK were crowned champions for the first time last year at the third edition of the event.

The 4th edition of the Tournament, scheduled from the 28th February 2014 until 2nd March 2014, will not only feature teams from the Asian Region, i.e. Malaysia, Thailand, Hong Kong, Brunei and new comers Singapore, but also two teams from outside of Asia, namely New Zealand and South Africa - two test-rugby playing nations.

The advent of MCKK Premier 7s Rugby had generated tremendous excitement not only within the Malaysian Rugby community but also amongst its general public. At the Malaysian Schools level, the competition to become the respective State's School Rugby Champion had increased in intensity as only the State Champions are invited to the MCKK Premier 7s Rugby Tournament. Amongst the general public in Kuala Kangsar, MCKK Premier 7s Tournament has brought fresh excitement to this normally rustic Royal Town and unsurprisingly, the Tournament is now a major event in the tourist calendar - injecting much needed funds into not only the local Kuala Kangsar economy but also the surrounding areas, including Ipoh and Taiping.

At the national level, MCKK Premier 7s Rugby Tournament has been extensively promoted in both the mainstream as well as alternative media - an innovation which has created extensive interest to a segment of the Malaysian population previously unexposed to rugby. The success of the MCKK Premier 7s has spurred the development and introduction of new rugby competitions such as Super Six Rugby Tournament in 2013 which feature six traditional Malaysian Schools rugby powerhouses in a National level Under 16 competition. Another initiative which developed from the MCKK Premier 7s Tournament, spearheaded jointly by MCOBA and COBRA - a prominent Malaysian Rugby Club, is the holding of rugby coaching clinics for students from schools in Northern Perak - an area once known as a rugby stronghold but had fallen on "hard times" in recent years and it is hope that the coaching clinics will prove the catalyst for the regeneration of rugby in the area.

ACADEMIC ATTACHMENT PROGRAMME IN DUBLIN

Dia duit!, Irish meaning "hello". From the 19th till the 27th of October 2013, The Malay College Kuala Kangsar sent 6 students namely Syahiran, Iskandar, Rahimi, Iqbal, Syafiq and Danial alongside the organizer-principal, Mr. Anand to participate in an Academic Attachment Programme at St. Mary's College in the heart of Ireland's bustling city centre, Baile Átha Cliath or more commonly known internationally as Dublin. The whole programme lasted for about a week in Europe's wettest and windiest city.

After a 14-hour flight from Kuala Lumpur, the plane finally touched down safely at Dublin International Airport. Upon arrival on that chilly morning, we were warmly greeted by Mr. Kamarul, the Head of Education Malaysia, Ireland. During the journey to our hostel, the driver from the embassy, Henry, informed us about the island's capital's colourful and interesting history and also the many monuments and historical landmarks.

After we checked in at Malaysia Hall Dublin on that cold but fine Sunday afternoon, we went on a short walkabout through one of the most beautiful parks in Dublin which is the St. Stephens Green Park, leading to Dublin's busiest shopping district, Grafton Street. All walks of life can be seen window shopping along the stretch of red brick pedestrian walkways. From buskers doing various performances, teenagers in trendy River Island apparels, the street was jam-packed with locals and tourists.

At 8.00 a.m. Monday, Mr. Kamarul picked us up and sent us to a territory none of us ever ventured before. Anxious but excited, we started our school day with an introduction session with the coordinator for the year we are attending, Mr. Nisbet. Since each Year at St. Mary's College consisted of 3 classes, the six MCKK students were divided into 3 pairs, a pair for each class. The Year that we are attending is known as the "Transition Year", where students are given early exposure to the elective subjects which will be available for them to choose during the following year. The year's activities are filled with projects, similar to the Malaysian education system of Penilaian Berasaskan Sekolah. Some of the new subjects that were taught to us Form 3 boys include Irish, German, Latin, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Career, Global Cultural Political Education (GCPE) and also Business. The advantage of having this Transition Year is that students can be comfortable with the subjects they are interested in taking for the next year, therefore producing better informed students.

We attended school like any ordinary Irish students from 8.30 a.m. till 3.30 p.m. everyday. We participated in class discussions, and a couple of us even had to do short presentations, but Syafiq topped it all. He pointed out an error that his Maths teacher had unconsciously written on the board while explaining a calculation that had produced a wrong answer. Syafiq was called to make the correction, and he became the talk of the school over the following couple of days.

We also took part in co-curricular activities. Syahiran got the best experience; he joined their rugby Wednesday afternoon training. Complete with koleq

jersey and boots, Syahiran joined their u-16 B team for a 90-minute drill session. Amazingly, St Mary's College has 34 rugby teams at all levels. Three coaches were there to attend to Syahiran's group that day. More amazingly, they have 33 members in their coaching panel, the majority being former students, young and old. It is not surprising then that every year they would be Dublin schoolboys champion in at least one age group. Rugby is a tradition they are proud of. At the highest level, St Mary's College holds a grand record: they have the highest number (six) of former students who have gone on to represent British Lions, compared to all other illustrious Dublin schools.

The 5 days attending St. Mary's College ended with a BANG! when Mr. Murphy, the college principal, called for an assembly attended by all 500-odd students and teachers to formally bid us farewell. We presented to them a Dikir Barat of a current Irish hit song.

Our involvement in the Irish school did not go unnoticed. The Director of Education Malaysia in UK and Eire treated us to a fancy dinner. Other than that, koleq old boys, including former head prefect Ahmad Idzri, who are continuing their studies in Ireland also chipped in to treat us to an Italian dinner. Most significant, however, was the surprise high-tea hosted by the Ambassador of Malaysia to Ireland at our Embassy building. Dato Ambassador gave a light-hearted introduction to politics and diplomacy.

Mr. Anand's strong contacts with RCSI enabled us to be given a special one-hour guided tour of the Royal College of Surgeons Ireland. Some of us hope to return to RCSI in 4 years' time as medical students. Before leaving this newly beloved country for home, we spent the Saturday on an educational 'hop-on hop-off' tour around Dublin. We gaped our mouth in awe upon seeing the beauty of Dublin beyond our usual morning route to school. From the parks where humans and deer live side by side in harmony, to the Court of Justice, which won many awards for its unprecedented architectural value, we were amazed at how many things that required hard work and an unimaginable amount of creativity to create are located in this otherwise miserable city plagued with heavy rain and strong winds.

Alas, our time in Ireland had to end, albeit on a happy note. We wished we could have stayed for another week if not more. During the trip we acquired new friends, new experience and of course, not to mention maintaining our friendship between one another. MCKK PREMIER 7s 2014 TOURNAMENT RULES

1. COMPETITION FORMAT

- a. The tournament will be a twenty four (24) team event.
- b. The teams will be divided into six (6) groups of four (4) teams each.
- c. Preliminary Round**
 - i. Teams in the respective groups will play a round-robin format within their groups. Each team shall play three (3) matches against teams in their groups.
 - a. If two (2) or more teams in the same group finish with the same number of points, the following shall determine the placing in the group.
 - b. The team with the greater point difference (points for, less points against) shall be declared the winner.
 - c. If a decision is still not reached, then the total points derived through tries, goals and penalties by each team shall be considered, priority being given in that order. Hence the team that scored more of its points through tries shall be declared the winner over a team that scored less tries. If there should be a further tie, then the number of goals shall be considered and so on, in the stated order.
 - d. If a decision is still not reached, the qualifying order shall be determined by the drawing of lots.
 - ii. If any team gives a walkover in the Group matches, all their games will be deemed null and void. They will be placed last in their group irrespective of the results of their other matches.

d. Quarter-Final Round

After the Group matches,

- i. Champions of each groups will be ranked 1st to 6th
- ii. Second placed teams will be ranked 7th to 12th
- iii. Third placed teams will be ranked 13th to 18th
- iv. Fourth placed teams will be ranked 19th to 24th

Then,

- i. Teams ranked 1st to 8th will advance to the Quarter-finals for the Cup and Plate pools. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- ii. Teams ranked 9th to 16th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Bowl pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- iii. Teams ranked 17th to 24th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Shield pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.

e. Semi-final Round

- i. The winners of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will advance to the semi- finals of the CUP Championship.
- ii. The losers of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will proceed to the semi- finals of the PLATE Championship.
- iii. The winners of the Bowl quarter-finals will advance to the semi--finals of the BOWL Championship.
- iv. The winners of the Shield quarter-finals will advance to the semi--finals of the SHIELD Championship.
- v. The losers of BOTH the Bowl AND Shield quarter-finals are eliminated.

f. Finals

Winners of all of the semi-finals will advance to the finals of their respective pools.

2. REGISTRATION

- a. All teams are to submit their Team Registration Form giving the final list of Twelve (12) players in their squad and their officials to the Tournament Director at the Manager's Meeting on the 28 FEBRUARY 2014 .
- b. Teams/Schools are allowed to register only their currently registered students, born in 1997 or later as players.

- c. During the tournament, Team Managers must register their team playing list with the Tournament Director, at the Tournament Control Centre at the field, no less than thirty (30) minutes before the commencement of their match.
- d. All Team Managers must personally register their team, with the full names of their players as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- e. Any late entries and proposed registration after the official registration deadline as in Rule 2 (c) will not be entertained, unless with prior consent of the Tournament Director.
- f. All teams must register a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of twelve (12) players upon submission of their team playing lists. No additional registration, transfer, replacement or change of team members will be permitted after the close of registration as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- g. In the event that, due to injuries, a team is unable to field a full complement of players derived from its own squad of twelve (12) registered players, such team may borrow no more than two (2) substitute players from any other team that has been eliminated from the Tournament. However, such players to be replaced have to be certified unfit to play by the Tournament Medical Officer.

A team that borrows a player or players must take the field with all their own available and uninjured players before using the replacement players. Such substitute players must be registered with the Tournament Director and can play subject to their new team using all their players first; these substitute players shall not be permitted to represent any other team during the remaining rounds of the Tournament.

3. PENALTIES

- a. Any team that plays with an unregistered player at any time during the Tournament shall forfeit their game.
- b. Any team that fields less than five (5) players in their scheduled game shall forfeit that game.

4. REPORTING TIMES

- a. All teams must be at the field-side five (5) minutes before the scheduled kick-off of each of their games.
- b. Any team that does not field a complete team as in Rule (3) above, five (5) minutes after scheduled kick-off, will forfeit their game, provided their opposing team is on the field.
- c. If both opposing teams fail to report to the Referee on the field of play five (5) minutes after the scheduled kick-off, both teams will forfeit their game.

All team captains / managers must register the names of their own seven (7) playing members for a game at the Tournament Control Centre thirty (30) minutes before commencement of the game. Additional registration forms are available from the Tournament Control Centre. It is the responsibility of Team Managers to ensure that teams obtain these forms.

5. REPLACEMENTS

Rolling substitutions are allowed at any time during a game. Only three (3) substitute players are allowed for each game. The substitute player must report to the match official at the half way line and the player to be replaced must leave the field and report to the match official before the substitute player is released onto the field.

6. PLAYING TIME

- a. All matches except the finals shall be played in two (2) halves of seven (7) minutes each way with a one (1) minute interval between halves. The Finals will be played in two (2) halves of ten (10) minutes each way with a two (2) minute interval between halves.
- b. Preliminary Round - The preliminary round will be played on a round-robin basis. The score will stand at the end of regulation time. There will be no extra time for matches ending in a draw.

c. Quarter-final, Semi-final and Final Rounds.

- i. All matches at these stages will be played on a knock-out basis. Should a match result in a draw at the end of regulation time, extra time will be played.
- ii. Such extra time shall consist of periods of five (5) minutes "sudden death" play-off. There will be no break in between the periods and teams will change ends immediately. The team which first kicked-off the match will do so again in the "sudden death" extra-time.
- iii. The "sudden-death" rule shall apply as follows. The first team to score during extra time will be declared the winner and the game will end.
- iv. In the event of still no winner, "sudden death" penalty drop-kicks of up to three (3) kickers each team will be applied.

If a decision is still not reached, the winner shall be ultimately determined by the toss of coin.

7. AWARDING OF POINTS - PRELIMINARY ROUND

Points will be awarded as follows:

WIN - Three (3) Points

DRAW - One (1) Point

WALKOVER - Three (3) Points

LOSS - Zero (0) Points

8. OFFICIAL PLAYING RULES

The Tournament By-Laws are based on the International Rugby Board (IRB) By-Laws with seven-a-side variations of the game as adopted by the Malaysian Rugby Union. These by-laws will apply throughout the tournament, except the following:-

The number of players in the team will be seven (7). The number of players required in a scrum is three (3)

Sin Bin: If a player is sent to the "Sin - Bin" by the referee he must proceed immediately to the designated position at the Referees' Control Stand. He must remain stationary there for a period of two (2) mins. Only when present at the Referees' Control Stand will the period of two (2) minutes commence. Only the referee may authorise a return to play after a "Sin - Bin" period and only at the next stoppage.

9. TECHNICAL ZONE PROTOCOL

The Technical Zone Protocol as introduced by the IRB in May 2006 will be implemented during this Tournament.

- During a game, other than the team's registered players, each participating team is allowed two (2) representatives (Team Manager and Coach) operating from their Technical Zone.
- No additional people are allowed in the Technical Zone.
- The medical personnel in the Technical Zone may enter the field of play in accordance with Law at any time a player is injured.
- Water carriers may only take water onto the field during stoppages in play for injuries in the playing area and when a try has been scored and at no other times.
- Water carriers must remain in the Technical Zone except when providing water as detailed above.
- Water bottles must not be thrown onto the field.
- All personnel in the Technical Zone must wear a bib / vest for identification purposes and must not wear a shirt similar in colour to their team.
- The fourth official will manage the Technical Zone and will report any indiscretion to the match referee. The match referee may caution the offender or expel them from the playing enclosure. Any offender may be reported to the Disciplinary Committee for investigation and further action.
- Replacement players and all other team officials other than those in the Technical Zone must remain seated on the replacement bench.

- Replacement players are only allowed to warm up before they enter the field in a designated place set further back from the field of play than the replacement bench.

10. "HOME" & "AWAY" TEAMS

These terms are used in a game should there be a clash of jersey colours. In this situation, the "HOME" team shall have to change its jerseys to a set of acceptable colour.

11. PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted in writing through Team Managers to the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game during which the matter of the protest occurred. Verbal protests will not be entertained. A protest must be submitted together with a deposit of RM100. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. Should the protest be overruled, the deposit will be forfeited.

12. APPEAL & DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- a. This Committee shall hear all appeals and decide on disciplinary action for the duration of the Tournament. The Tournament Director shall be co-opted at any hearing of the Committee but shall have no vote.
- b. Players or Team Officials reported for misconduct or sent off the field shall have their cases considered as soon as possible by the Committee.
- c. Any player who is sent off the field shall be automatically suspended for one (1) game and the Committee shall determine his further participation in the Tournament.
- d. Any player that receives more than one (1) Yellow card in the Tournament shall be automatically suspended for the subsequent game. The Committee shall determine his further participation in the tournament.
- e. The quorum for the meeting of this Committee shall be three (4) members:
 - a) **Tournament Director (Co-opted)**
 - b) **Technical Director**
 - c) **2 Independent Team Managers**

Disciplinary action taken by the Committee shall only apply for the duration of the Tournament. The Committee shall report the actions taken to relevant bodies for any further review.

13. INTERPRETATION OF TOURNAMENT RULES

The Organising Committee reserves the right of interpretation in the case of doubts arising from the wording of any rule. It shall also have the right to decide on any situation that is not covered by the rules and such decision shall be final.

14. TROPHY OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY

- a. The NJ Ryan Trophy (Tournament Trophy) remains the property of MCKK/MCOBA and cannot be won outright.
- b. The winning team shall receive the Trophy and a replica, but will have to return the Trophy to the Organising Committee before they depart for home.

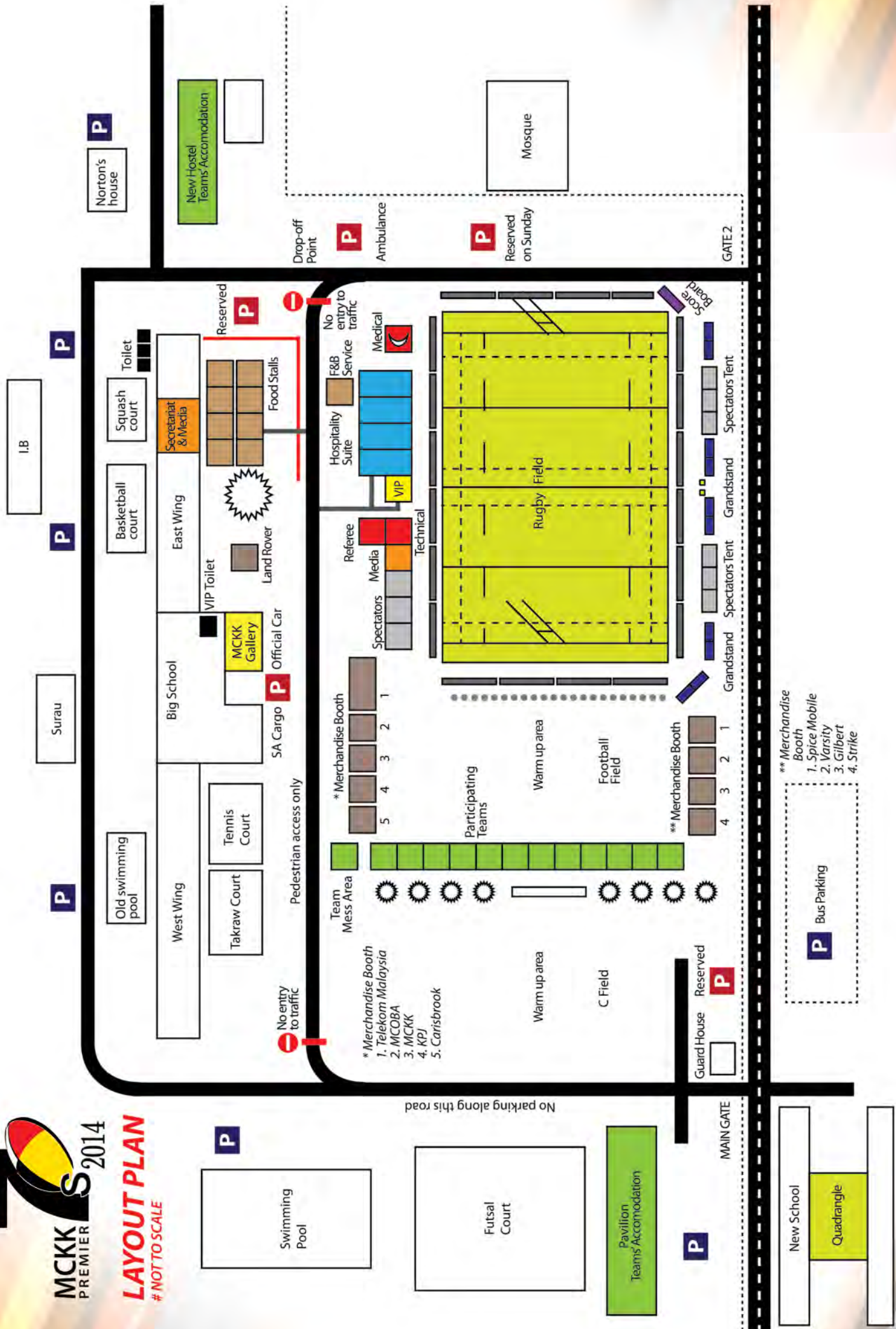

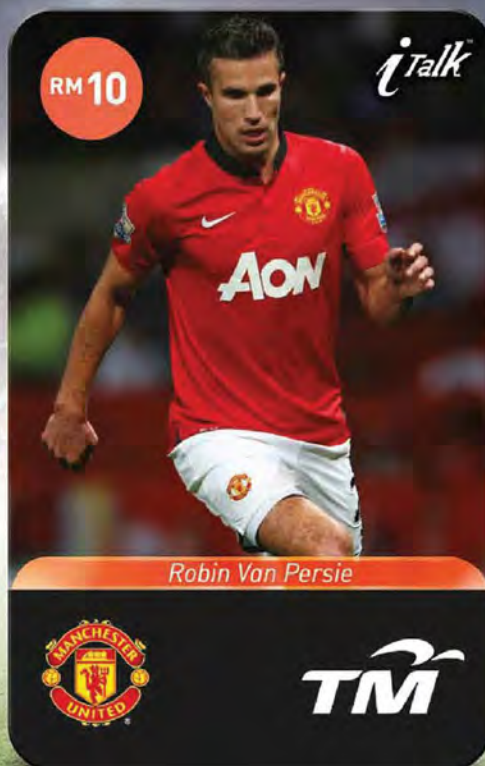
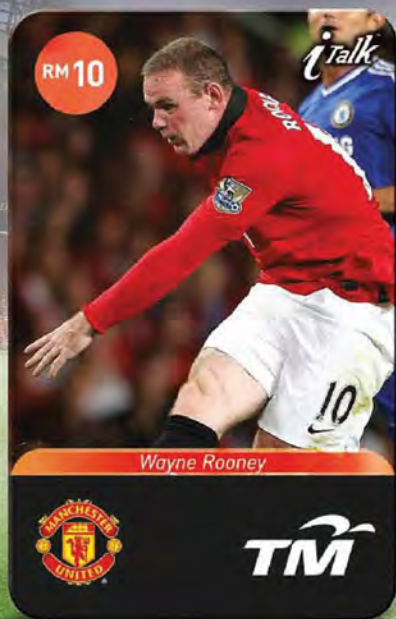
