Victoria Bridge of Kuala Kangsar

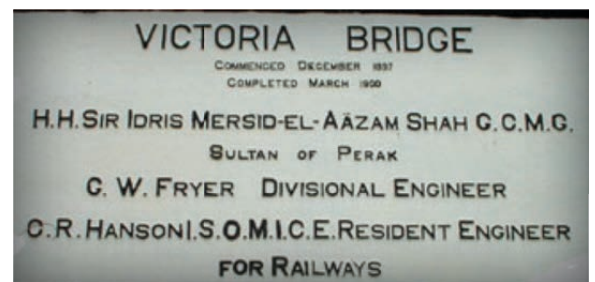


Ask any Malay College Old Boy (MCOB) what's nostalgic about their life in MCKK, inevitably the subject will gravitate towards the journeys to and from Kuala Kangsar during their College days and for most of us, the journeys were made using trains ran by the national railways company Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTM). Those were the days of warrant tickets and journeys of days - if not long hours, where seats were scarce on the third class coaches and upon boarding the train at Kuala Kangsar Train Station, Budak-budak Kolet would find themselves standing in between the carriages or sitting on the carriages' steps with an arm wrapped around (and there were even times when only the fingers were holding on to) the hand hold bars that were placed at the sides of the doors while the trains made its way up or down the west coast of Peninsular Malaysia. Dangerous it was but it was something that MCKK boys had taken for granted as there were no other choices accorded to us back in the good old days.

In the early 80s, it was common for us to come back to Kolet from the holidays a day or two early - of course the parents were told the official reason of finishing up assignments and the likes but never did I see anybody holding a pen much less a book during those days prior to the start of the school term. Suffice to say, we had fun doing all sort of activities sans the supervision of prefects and wardens.



H. H. The Sultan of Perak.



For those arriving by train from the South then, nothing signals the impending arrival in Kuala Kangsar more than when the KTM train crosses the Perak River using the historical Victoria Bridge.

Located near the small rural town of Karai, Victoria Bridge is one of the oldest railway bridge in the country. Commissioned by Perak State Railways, construction began in 1897 – the year of Queen Victoria’s Diamond Jubilee, and was completed at the turn of the century. Costing a then princely sum of \$300,000, the bridge was officially opened by the Sultan of Perak – Almarhum Sultan Idris Murshidul Azzam Shah on 21 March 1900. “The ceremonial opening of the bridge comprised unlocking of a bar traversing the portal with a silver key”

In his speech during the opening ceremony, Sir Frank Swettenham, the Resident General of The Federated Malay States (Negeri-Negeri Melayu Bersekutu), described the bridge as the “largest bridge in the East outside India”. The ceremony was also attended by the acting British Resident for Perak, Sir John Pickersgill Rodger.

Affectionately known to locals as Gerotak Enggor (pronounced as Gher Ghaw Torque Eng Gore) due to its location at the riverside village of Enggor, the bridge was designed as a single track railway truss bridge featuring over a thousand feet of iron lattice steel girders resting on six brick piers “with the roadway 40 feet above the ordinary level of the river”. Originally part of Perak Railways line intended to connect Karai and Telok Anson (now Teluk Intan), the bridge became part of the Perai – Johor Bahru railway line under the Federated Malay States Railways (FMSR) circa 1910. The FMSR was renamed Malayan Railways in 1948 before assuming its current name of Keretapi Tanah Melayu (KTM) in 1962



Time, and technology, has caught up with the majestic Victoria Bridge – it is no longer in use since 2002 when a new concrete bridge parallel to it was built as part of KTM's Double Tracking initiative. Though no longer functioning as a railway bridge, its adjoining footbridge is still being used by the local kampong folks as a means to cross the Perak river on foot or by using bicycles and motorcycles.

The decommissioning of the Victoria Bridge has resulted in it becoming a tourist attraction with scores of tourists walking up to the bridge from the Karai side especially in the mornings and evenings. The not so adventurous and / or those suffering from vertigo would be contented to taking selfies and wefies at the head of the bridge while the more adventurous would attempt to walk along the bridge to cross the Perak River using its metal footbridge. Of course, there will always be the "rules are meant to be broken" types who will naturally decide to walk along the railway line itself rather than using the footbridge.

In 2015, in conjunction with Victoria Bridge's 115th Anniversary, the Ministry of Tourism and Culture announced that it is in the process of obtaining approval from the Perak State Government to turn the bridge into a national heritage to ensure it will be adequately protected and heritage value retained.

Oh yes, in the event of you actually made it to the Victoria Bridge, do take the time to stop at the various Karai Town eateries to taste the local delicacies such as the Kundas, essentially the Perak Mamak's version of Chakoi, which to MCOBs of 70s and 80s vintage, its the nearest you can get to Mak Cik Kantin's Kueh Bantal.

Rugby and The Olympics



With the sport making a return to the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro about a year after the World Cup, this could well be the game-changer for rugby in terms of still a wider global interest.

All the RWC 2015 matches played to almost a full house at every stadium in England and Wales and there's a chance crowd support in Rio could be just as good.

Rugby was an Olympics sport at four Games from the turn of last century and was played in the 15s format, unlike in Rio with the 7s, which many find more exciting where pure entertainment value is concerned. It's also a format that gives better hopes of success to lesser known teams in the world order.

So it's 92 years since that Paris Games when rugby was last played at the Olympics and that's a long time indeed.

There have been many changes to the sport since – the rules, points system, the refereeing, everything – that it's worth a while to revisit those years.

France won gold at rugby's inaugural Olympics appearance in Paris but before anyone gets over-excited, bear in

mind that only three teams participated. Britain and Germany were represented by club teams. No All Blacks, no Springboks. No team had to first compete elsewhere to qualify.

Fast forward to 1908 in London and there were Australasia (to include Australia and New Zealand) but represented only by an Aussie team that was already touring Britain, which in turn was represented by a relatively weak Cornwall team that was beaten by the touring Aussies earlier. France withdrew at the last minute.

It could have been slightly better 12 years later in Antwerp if not for the late pullout by Czechoslovakia and Romania to leave only France, Britain and the United States to fight for the honours. The Americans won gold and repeated this four years later, again in Paris, with a team comprising mainly players from California.

France and Romania were the other teams in 1924, from which the negative was a crowd invasion by the home crowd after the final whistle.

Despite the very small number of teams, the crowd at the final in 1920 and 1924 were fairly decent, reaching 20,000



and 21,000 respectively. The crowd of 6,000 for a match during the 1920 Games in Paris, though much smaller than for the other two finals, was the largest for the entire event.

After being dropped from the Games, there continued to be numerous attempts to reinstate rugby at the world's biggest multi-sport event but all failed, until October 2009.

Rio will be host to 12 teams each for the men's and women's competitions, including host Brazil who qualify automatically. The 12th team to qualify for both categories will be known at a competition in June. By the time the MCKK Premier 7s ends, teams going to Rio will be in the final phases of their preparations for the Las Vegas leg of the World Series, the fifth of 10 legs.

With four legs played, the table is topped by Fiji on points for and against although the Pacific Islanders tie on competition points with South Africa (second) and New Zealand.

The All Blacks Sevens had a poor first two legs, partly hampered by injuries to key players, but a changed squad that brought in several players with Super Rugby experience for Wellington and Sydney turned things around for them and gave them two titles on a trot.

What rugby's inclusion in the Olympics has done has obviously been to encourage lower ranked teams to put in more emphasis on their Sevens squads, with the realisation that in the truncated format, even the top ranked team in the world can be beaten. The United

States, for example, did a number on the All Blacks Sevens twice in Dubai and again the following weekend in Cape Town.

Canada and Kenya too have done reasonably well.

The NZ women also did poorly in Dubai early last December to finish fifth of 12 teams and would want to do better in the second of five legs in Sao Paulo. The team is currently at a training camp in Florida.

The NZ Women's 7s have been almost untouchable in the last several years, winning the Hong Kong tournament 10 times from 1997 to 2007, the then IRB Sevens Series in 2013 and 2014 and the Sevens World title in 2013.

But just like in the men's category, in 7s you can't take your leg off the brake for even a minute.

Australia is getting stronger and so too lower ranked teams like France, Russia and Canada.

Not something that would bring the smile to the faces of the hardcore supporters of New Zealand rugby, of whom there are many here in Kuala Kangsar, but definitely the kind of progress the administrators at World Rugby would be keen to trumpet on.

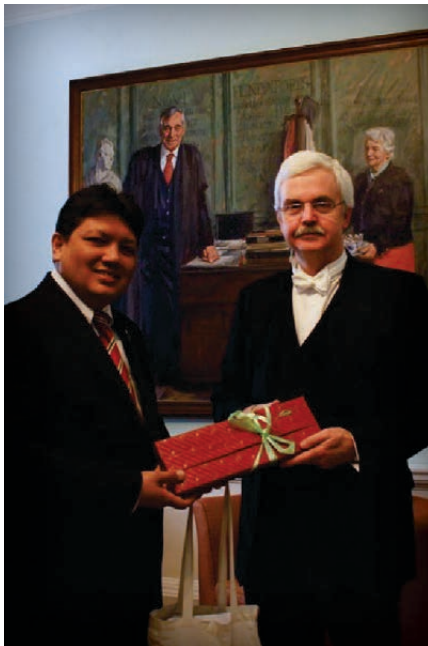

High Five for MCKK Eton Fives



Before rugby was introduced by headmaster Neil Ryan, popular sports like football, hockey, cricket and tennis were already played in MCKK. Another interesting and unique sport was Eton Fives, or EF for short. Unlike the many other sports that continue to grow in popularity, EF 'disappeared' circa 1964 onward, more than half a century ago. Nobody could give a good explanation on the 'demise' of EF. What remained however, is the sturdy structure housing the two courts. Over five decades the courts have been used for various means; as storage area, and it had also been mentioned as a venue 'to settle old scores'.

But in 2013, on the occasion of batch of 1963's 50th anniversary, Eton Fives was given a new lease of life. Luckily for MCKK, for at almost the same time, the Eton Fives Association of the United Kingdom (EFA) also had

a look at our courts with a view to reintroduce the game to the present boys. So a concerted effort to bring EF back to life took off with the cooperation among MCKK, EFA and MCOBA; notably batch of '63. Eventually, on 13th January 2015, EF revival in MCKK was celebrated.

Eton Fives, first played formally in Eton College in 1877, is a game quite similar to modern-day squash except that EF is played without any racquets but with both palms protected with leather gloves hitting a rubber ball onto the front wall. A point is earned when the opponent failed to return the ball, or when the ball has bounced twice on the floor. An EF court is only three-sided, without the back wall. Unlike squash, EF is only played as a doubles game. Another interesting fact, EF is contested without any umpire; the players amicably settle their on-court disputes.



Batch of '63 announced their intention in 2013. The following year, in September 2014, together with EFA, they co-financed two young EF coaches from Berkhamsted College for a 3-week coaching stint in MCKK to introduce to collegians (and teachers too) the finer points of the game and also to give intensive training sessions to a group of boys who have taken the game to heart.

EF in MCKK received a massive boost when EFA invited us to participate in the year's most prestigious tournament in Eton College. Enthusiastically, we started our preparations, beginning with the inter-house tournament in early 2015. Eventually, four boys were selected: Iqbal and Afzan making up the senior u-16 pair, while Syamil and Fayyadh would play in the junior u-15 category to represent MCKK. Led by Master Fidzamil, the contingent departed for London on the 12th of March 2015.

For the boys especially, the trip was not just about the EF tournament. The boys met up again with Anthony Theodossi and Ryan Perrie, their coaches the previous September, and Berkhamsted College provided the facilities for the boys to train and spar with the local players. The boys stayed with the Skeltons and the Nichols, who to the boys' surprise knew that their dogs were to be kept

a safe distance from these Muslim boys. They attended school in the morning and experienced the vast difference how English schoolboys are more vocal and engaged when it comes to lesson discussions. The teachers they had the opportunity to interact with were nice and friendly.

In the tournament proper, no one had given us any target as this was our maiden participation. The preliminary group games took place from 14th March. Fate of the draw saw our junior pair up against an Eton College pair in their first game. The outcome was obvious, many thought. To the surprise of many, Syamil and Fayyadh, our junior MCKK pair defeated their more illustrious opponents. It may have been Eton College's 8th best pair that they managed to upset, but it cannot be taken away from these MCKK boys that they have only been introduced to the game for a few months. That victory was celebrated with great joy by members of batch '63 who had been following the adventure from back home.

The senior boys also got a win under their belt. Both teams secured enough points to qualify into the final-16 knockout stage from the eight preliminary groups. Good things had to come to an end; both pairs didn't get through past the first knockout stage.

It has been mentioned earlier that EF is a game without an umpire. Any disputes should be settled by the four players. Another wonderful anecdote worth sharing was an incident when our senior boys offered a 'let' before their opponent contested that particular play. True sportsmanship indeed. This was highlighted to us back home via email from the EFA official who witnessed this exemplary act.

The experience in Eton College was not like the one they experienced at Berkhamsted College. The boys only stayed in the rooms provided but couldn't attend any other college activities. They managed to catch a glimpse of the dining hall and cafeteria, which in many ways are very different from ours. The Eton College boys, in the splendor of their college uniform, who were not involved in the tournament looked 'very busy', moving from one place to the other at great speed.

All in all it was a very interesting experience, one to be savoured for a very long time. Thanks to those enthusiastic members of Class of '63, MCOBA President, EFA, Berkhamsted College, MCKK PIBG, and MCKK Foundation, this adventure was made possible. Over a long period of time we have been referred to as the 'Eton of the East'. Finally the chance came our way for East Eton to set foot on the 'real' Eton, and to make an impact.

Farewell my friends...



The MCOBA Annual Dinner & Concert 2015 was the last official MCOBA event attended by Almarhum Pak Ungku.

Datuk Seri Tunku Adnan Tunku Besar Burhanuddin, a patriarch in the Negri Sembilan royal household and the Malaysian chef de mission to the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics, died in Kuala Lumpur on 8th Feb 2016. He was 89. And when news of his passing broke at breakfast on the first day of Chinese New Year, I was quickly reminded of an early morning telephone call from him less than a year ago just to tell me how happy he was that the two menacing black spots in his lungs had sensationally disappeared.

Hang on, I thought to myself as he was speaking, I knew he had had close calls before but I never realised there were “issues” about his lungs. Then he went on: “A few weeks ago, doctors detected two black spots in my lungs and after some tests confirmed the condition was serious and said they had to start chemotherapy treatment. “That was when some of my relatives suggested that I go for acupuncture and Chinese traditional herbal treatment, which I later agreed. After only two sessions of this treatment, further medical tests amazingly showed that that the black spots and cancer cells were gone. Isn’t that great?”

“Yes, certainly **Pak Ungku**. Patik will pray for your good health,” I said, addressing him in the normal but formal royal court language. Pak Ungku. Everyone outside the inner circle of the Negri royalty called him that, a term of respect plus endearment.



So Pak Ungku went on in that telephone conversation: "I want you to follow me to the acupuncture clinic on my next appointment and see for yourself. I will come and pick you up."

And there I was one afternoon witnessing him undergo treatment and getting prescribed with all kinds of Chinese herbs. It might not have been so mind-blowing if Pak Ungku was not, at that time, already 88 years old and that the cancer diagnosed earlier on him by doctors was at an advanced stage.

Pak Ungku had maintained occasional communication with me ever since his son Tunku A'amash died four years ago of leukaemia. A'amash, fondly called Vic, was not only my former classmate and very close buddy, he had also married my cousin, Sharifah Maheran Syed Mahadzar. So there was that kind of link, with Pak Ungku calling me every now and then to comment about what I had written in this column.

The connections between us did not end there since he was a patriarch not only of the Negri Sembilan royalty, but also among old boys of the Malay College Kuala Kangsar, of which I am one. He was more than a father figure to many of the old boys and, as honorary life president of MCOBA (The Malay College Old Boys Association) had always played a key role in many of its activities. He was an inspiration, the blue

blood in him showing no hindrance to his good-humoured, extroverted spirit. The tahlil prayers for him at Masjid Saidina Umar Al-Khattab in Damansara Heights last Friday, well attended by old boys, bore testimony of the esteem and high regard he had commanded.

Pak Ungku had had many close calls and near death experiences in his life, surviving a major road accident near Kuala Pilah many years ago, a boat capsize off Port Dickson followed very closely by a helicopter crash off Port Klang in 1972, a mishap which he would always relate to me.

But, all the fight in him sadly ended last week. I was told that the tumour had spread from the lungs to the intestines.

Pak Ungku, we will always remember you. Surely we belong to Allah and to Him shall we return.

The passing of Pak Ungku was one of the two sorrowful news of death I received last week. The other was that of Lim Boon Kheng, a former Penang football coach. He was 76.

Boon Kheng was one of the more successful coaches then, bringing Penang to the Malaysia Cup final against Singapore in 1977 in an epic match, which Penang lost 3-2. The football rivalry at that time was keenest among three teams – Penang, Singapore and Selangor.

As a reporter in Penang then, I had a close professional relationship with him, remembering some of his quotes till today uttered in thick Penang accent when he was upset with his charges, such as: Apa depa buat? Main macam leceh.

May his soul rest in peace.

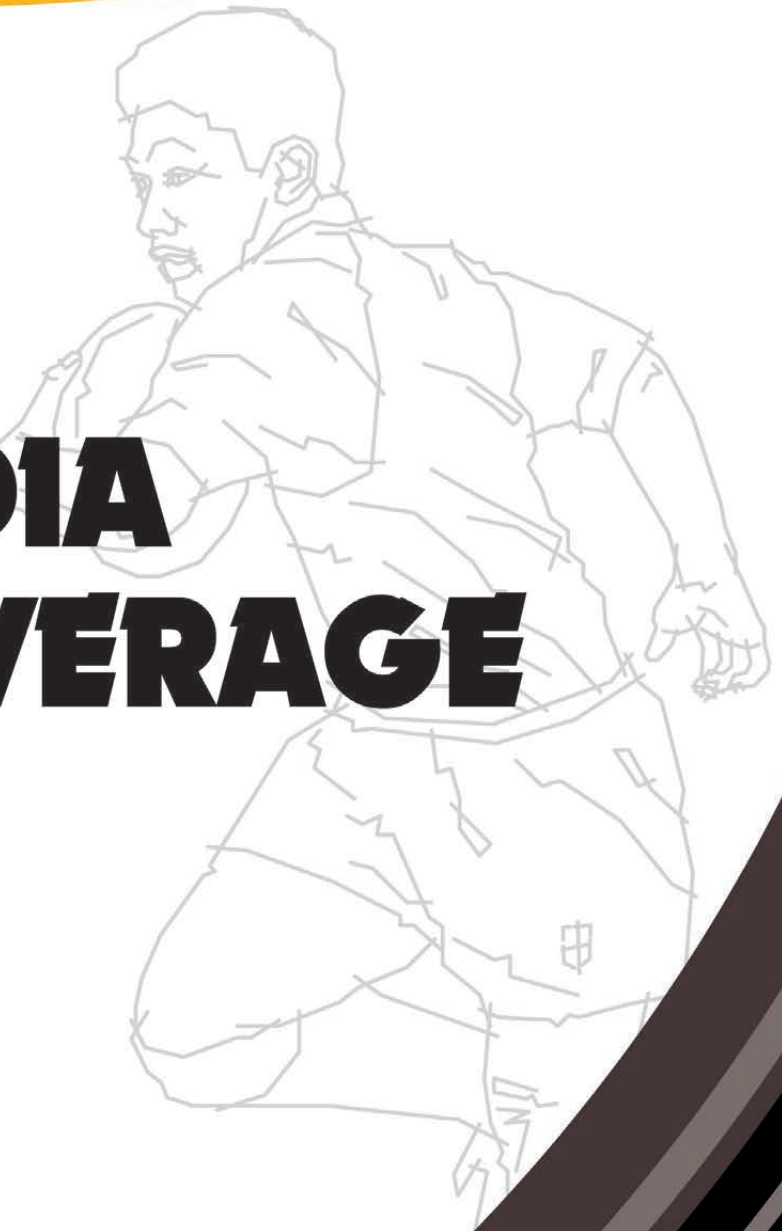

SINGAPORE-based Australian International School will add to the already glowing line-up of teams at this year's MCKK Premier 7s Rugby Championships from Feb 26-28 in Kuala Kangsar, Perak.

MCKK Premier 7s 2016 Tournament Rules

I. COMPETITION FORMAT

- a. a. The tournament will be a twenty four (24) team event.
- b. The teams will be divided into six (6) groups of four (4) teams each.
- c. **Preliminary Round**
 - i. Teams in the respective groups will play a round-robin format within their groups. Each team shall play three (3) matches against teams in their groups
 - a. If two (2) or more teams in the same group finish with the same number of points, the following shall determine the placing in the group.
 - b. The team with the greater point difference (points for, less points against) shall be declared the winner.
 - c. If a decision is still not reached, then the total points derived through tries, goals and penalties by each team shall be considered, priority being given in that order. Hence the team that scored more of its points through tries shall be declared the winner over a team that scored less tries. If there should be a further tie, then the number of goals shall be considered and so on, in the stated order.
 - d. If a decision is still not reached, the qualifying order shall be determined by the drawing of lots.
 - ii. If any team gives a walkover in the Group matches, all their games will be deemed null and void. They will be placed last in their group irrespective of the results of their other matches.
- d. **Quarter-Final Round**

After the Group matches,

 - i. Champions of each groups will be ranked 1st to 6th
 - ii. Second placed teams will be ranked 7th to 12th
 - iii. Third placed teams will be ranked 13th to 18th
 - iv. Fourth placed teams will be ranked 19th to 24th

Then,

 - i. Teams ranked 1st to 8th will advance to the Quarter-finals for the Cup and Plate pools. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
 - ii. Teams ranked 9th to 16th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Bowl pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
 - iii. Teams ranked 17th to 24th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Shield pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- e. **Semi-final Round**
 - i. The winners of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will advance to the semi- finals of the CUP Championship.
 - ii. The losers of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will proceed to the semi- finals of the PLATE Championship.
 - iii. The winners of the Bowl quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the BOWL Championship.
 - iv. The winners of the Shield quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the SHIELD Championship.
 - v. The losers of BOTH the Bowl AND Shield quarter-finals are eliminated.
- f. **Finals**

Winners of all of the semi-finals will advance to the finals of their respective pools.

2. REGISTRATION

- a. All teams are to submit their Team Registration Form giving the final list of Twelve (12) players in their squad and their officials to the Tournament Director at the Manager's Meeting on the **26 FEBRUARY 2016**.

- b. Teams/Schools are allowed to register only their **currently** registered students, born in **1999** or later as players.
- c. During the tournament, Team Managers must register their team playing list with the Tournament Director, at the Tournament Control Centre at the field, no less than thirty (30) minutes before the commencement of their match.
- d. All Team Managers must personally register their team, with the full names of their players as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- e. Any late entries and proposed registration after the official registration deadline as in Rule 2 (c) will not be entertained, unless with prior consent of the Tournament Director.
- f. All teams must register a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of twelve (12) players upon submission of their team playing lists. No additional registration, transfer, replacement or change of team members will be permitted after the close of registration as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- g. In the event that, due to injuries, a team is unable to field a full complement of players derived from its own squad of twelve (12) registered players, such team may borrow no more than two (2) substitute players from any other team that has been eliminated from the Tournament. However, such players to be replaced have to be certified unfit to play by the Tournament Medical Officer.

A team that borrows a player or players must take the field with all their own available and uninjured players before using the replacement players. Such substitute players must be registered with the Tournament Director and can play subject to their new team using all their players first; these substitute players shall not be permitted to represent any other team during the remaining rounds of the Tournament.

3. PENALTIES

- a. Any team that plays with an unregistered player at any time during the Tournament shall forfeit their game.
- b. Any team that fields less than five (5) players in their scheduled game shall forfeit that game.

4. REPORTING TIMES

- a. All teams must be at the field-side five (5) minutes before the scheduled kick-off of each of their games.
- b. Any team that does not field a complete team as in Rule (3) above, five (5) minutes after scheduled kick-off, will forfeit their game, provided their opposing team is on the field.
- c. If both opposing teams fail to report to the Referee on the field of play five (5) minutes after the scheduled kick-off, both teams will forfeit their game.

All team captains / managers must register the names of their own seven (7) playing members for a game at the Tournament Control Centre thirty (30) minutes before commencement of the game. Additional registration forms are available from the Tournament Control Centre. It is the responsibility of Team Managers to ensure that teams obtain these forms.

5. REPLACEMENTS

Rolling substitutions are allowed at any time during a game. Only three (3) substitute players are allowed for each game. The substitute player must report to the match official at the half way line and the player to be replaced must leave the field and report to the match official before the substitute player is released onto the field.

6. PLAYING TIME

- a. All matches except the finals shall be played in two (2) halves of seven (7) minutes each way with a one (1) minute interval between halves. The Finals will be played in two (2) halves of



ten (10) minutes each way with a two (2) minute interval between halves.

- b. Preliminary Round - The preliminary round will be played on a round-robin basis. The score will stand at the end of regulation time. There will be no extra time for matches ending in a draw.
- c. **Quarter-final, Semi-final and Final Rounds.**
 - i. All matches at these stages will be played on a knock-out basis. Should a match result in a draw at the end of regulation time, extra time will be played.
 - ii. Such extra time shall consist of periods of five (5) minutes "sudden death" play-off. There will be no break in between the periods and teams will change ends immediately. The team which first kicked-off the match will do so again in the "sudden death" extra-time.
 - iii. The "sudden-death" rule shall apply as follows. The first team to score during extra time will be declared the winner and the game will end.
 - iv. In the event of still no winner, "sudden death" penalty drop-kicks of up to three (3) kickers each team will be applied.

If a decision is still not reached, the winner shall be ultimately determined by the toss of coin.

7. AWARDING OF POINTS - PRELIMINARY ROUND

Points will be awarded as follows:

WIN - Three (3) Points

DRAW - One (1) Point

WALKOVER - Three (3) Points

LOSS - Zero (0) Points

8. OFFICIAL PLAYING RULES

The Tournament By-Laws are based on the International Rugby Board (IRB) By-Laws with seven-a-side variations of the game as adopted by the Malaysian Rugby Union. These by-laws will apply throughout the tournament, except the following:-

The number of players in the team will be seven (7). The number of players required in a scrum is three (3)

Sin Bin: If a player is sent to the "Sin - Bin" by the referee he must proceed immediately to the designated position at the Referees' Control Stand. He must remain stationary there for a period of two (2) mins. Only when present at the Referees' Control Stand will the period of two (2) minutes commence. Only the referee may authorise a return to play after a "Sin - Bin" period and only at the next stoppage.

9. TECHNICAL ZONE PROTOCOL

The Technical Zone Protocol as introduced by the IRB in May 2006 will be implemented during this Tournament.

- During a game, other than the team's registered players, each participating team is allowed two (2) representatives (Team Manager and Coach) operating from their Technical Zone.
- No additional people are allowed in the Technical Zone.
- The medical personnel in the Technical Zone may enter the field of play in accordance with Law at any time a player is injured.
- Water carriers may only take water onto the field during stoppages in play for injuries in the playing area and when a try has been scored and at no other times.
- Water carriers must remain in the Technical Zone except when providing water as detailed above.
- Water bottles must not be thrown onto the field.
- All personnel in the Technical Zone must wear a bib / vest for identification purposes and must not wear a shirt similar in colour to their team.

- The fourth official will manage the Technical Zone and will report any indiscretion to the match referee. The match referee may caution the offender or expel them from the playing enclosure. Any offender may be reported to the Disciplinary Committee for investigation and further action.
- Replacement players and all other team officials other than those in the Technical Zone must remain seated on the replacement bench.
- Replacement players are only allowed to warm up before they enter the field in a designated place set further back from the field of play than the replacement bench.

10. HOME & AWAY TEAMS

These terms are used in a game should there be a clash of jersey colours. In this situation, the "HOME" team shall have to change its jerseys to a set of acceptable colour.

11. PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted in writing through Team Managers to the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game during which the matter of the protest occurred. Verbal protests will not be entertained. A protest must be submitted together with a deposit of RM100. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. Should the protest be overruled, the deposit will be forfeited.

12. APPEAL & DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- a. This Committee shall hear all appeals and decide on disciplinary action for the duration of the Tournament. The Tournament Director shall be co-opted at any hearing of the Committee but shall have no vote.
- b. Players or Team Officials reported for misconduct or sent off the field shall have their cases considered as soon as possible by the Committee.
- c. Any player who is sent off the field shall be automatically suspended for one (1) game and the Committee shall determine his further participation in the Tournament.
- d. Any player that receives more than one (1) Yellow card in the Tournament shall be automatically suspended for the subsequent game. The Committee shall determine his further participation in the tournament.
- e. The quorum for the meeting of this Committee shall be three (4) members:
 - a) **Tournament Director (Co-opted)**
 - b) **Technical Director**
 - c) **2 Independent Team Managers**

Disciplinary action taken by the Committee shall only apply for the duration of the Tournament. The Committee shall report the actions taken to relevant bodies for any further review.

13. INTERPRETATION OF TOURNAMENT RULES

The Organising Committee reserves the right of interpretation in the case of doubts arising from the wording of any rule. It shall also have the right to decide on any situation that is not covered by the rules and such decision shall be final.

14. TROPHY OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY

- a. The NJ Ryan Trophy (Tournament Trophy) remains the property of MCKK/MCOBA and cannot be won outright.
- b. The winning team shall receive the Trophy and a replica, but will have to return the Trophy to the Organising Committee before they depart for home.

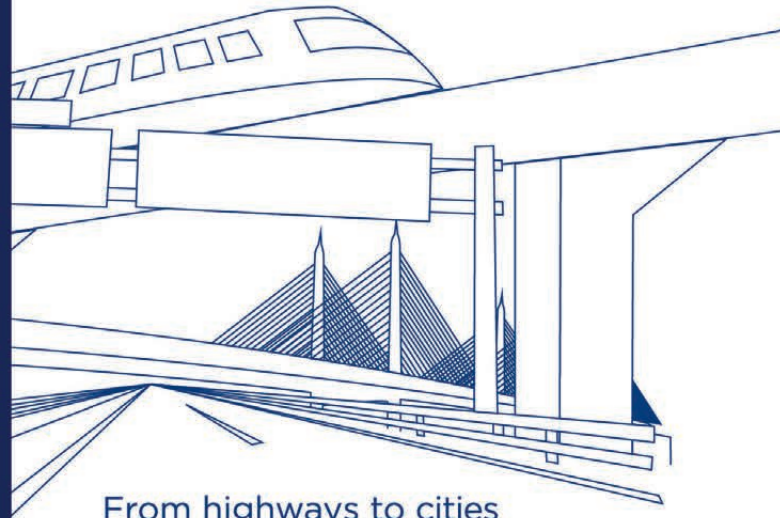

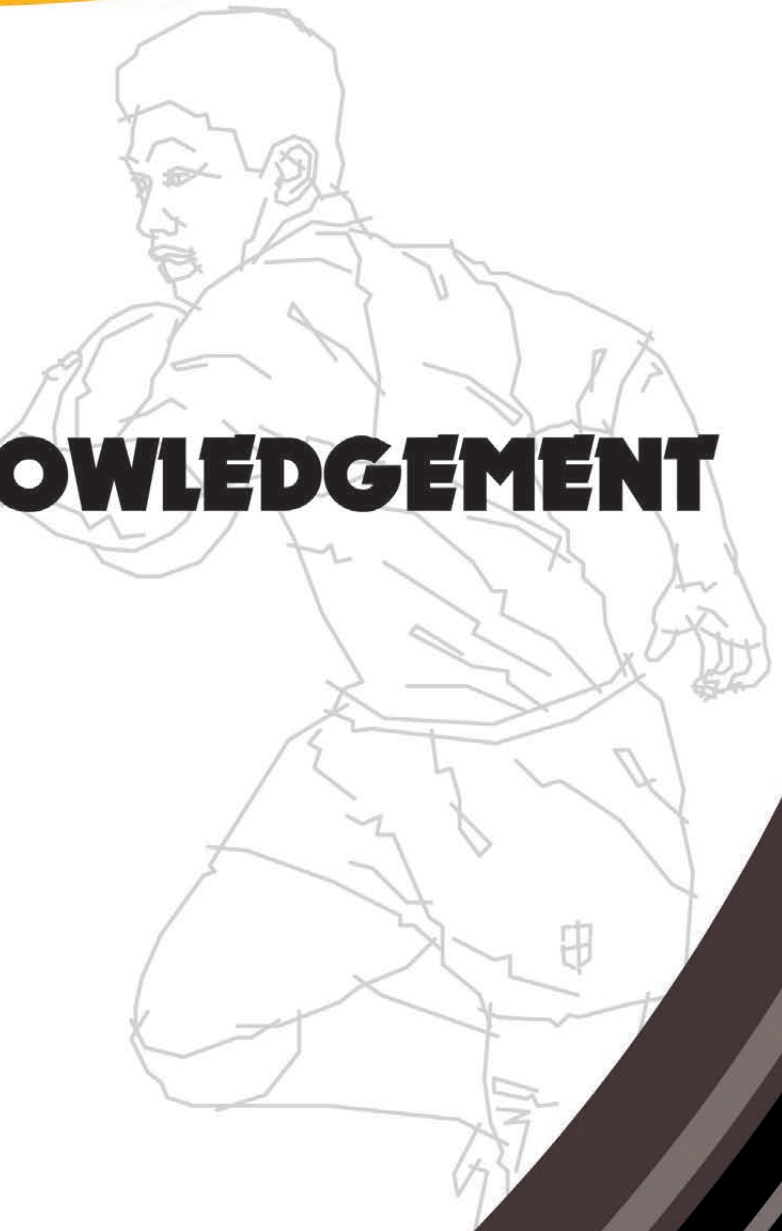

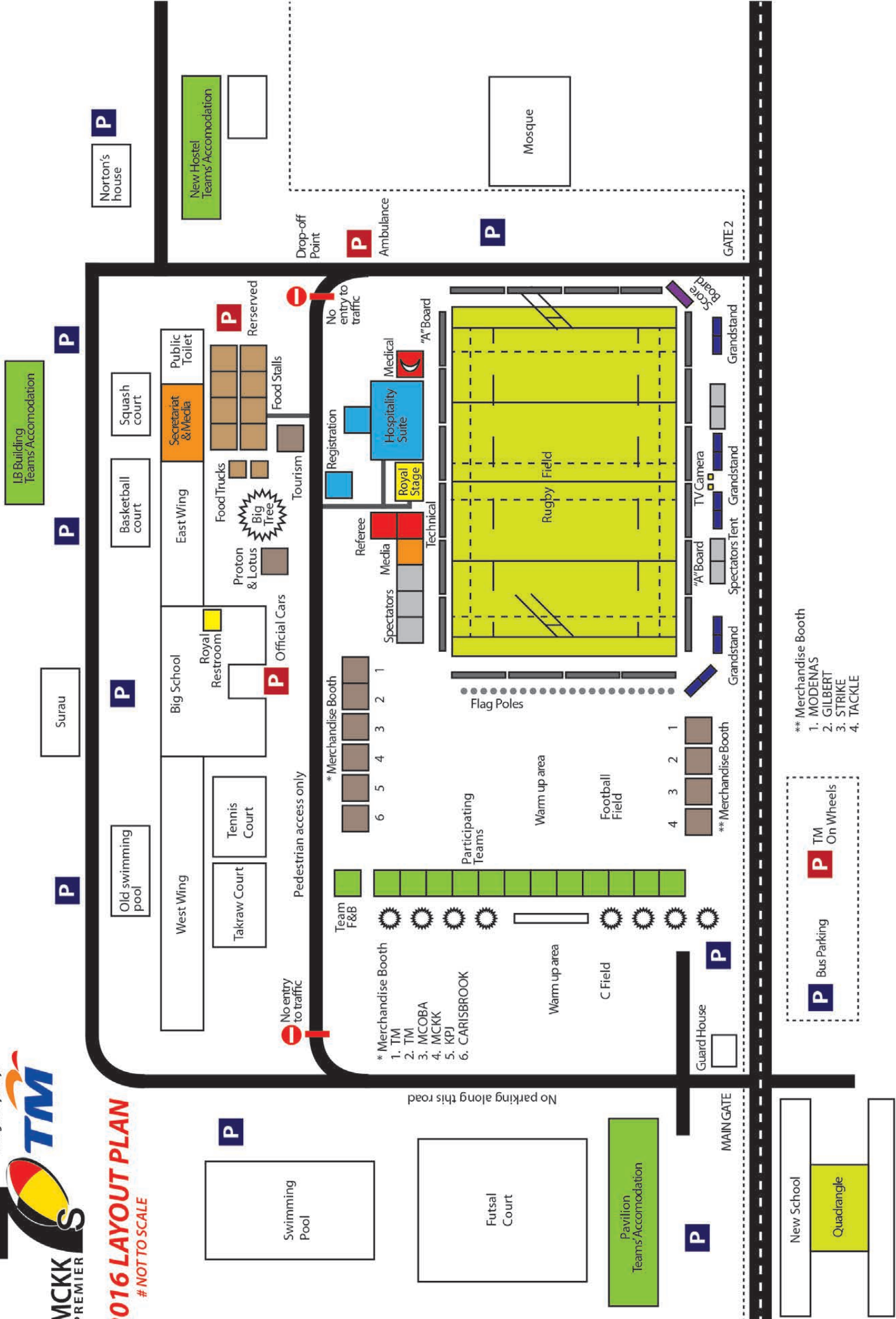
