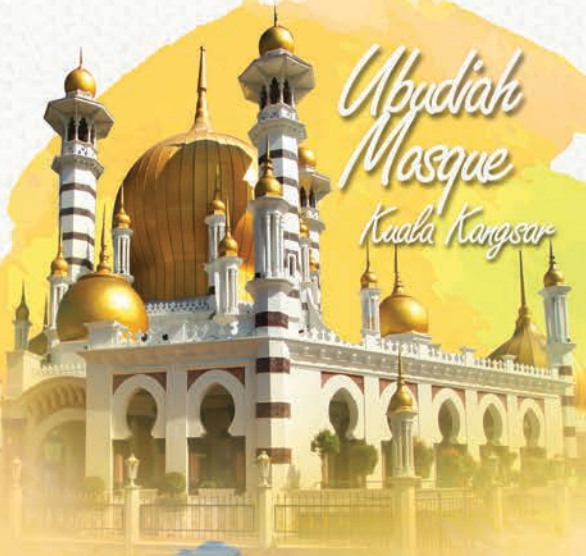

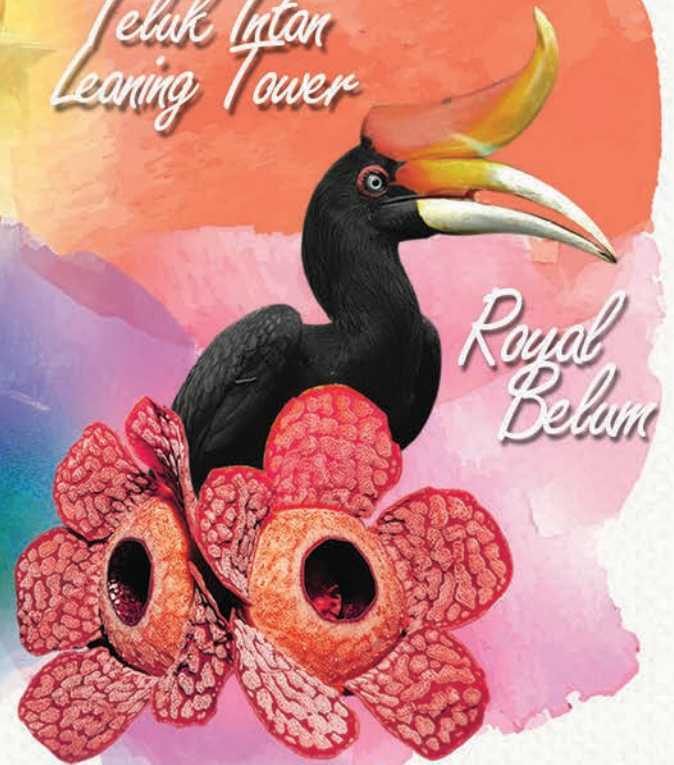

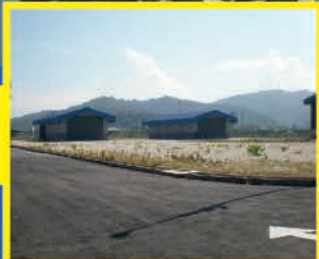

THE ART OF TEKAT

As the Royal Town of Perak, Kuala Kangsar is host to several traditional Malay craft industries which serviced the needs of Perak's Royal Palace over the centuries. One of these traditional craft industries is the craft known as Tekat.

Tekat is the art of embroidering gold or silver threads onto a dark coloured base material, such as velvet, silk or linen, and the end product is used to make objects ranging from daily items such as fans, pillow covers and bed spreads to wearable such as shoes and clothes to ceremonial items and royal paraphernalia. Legend has it that Tekat was first introduced to the Malay Archipelago during the Melaka Sultanate of the 15th Century and its early developments influenced by Melaka's then trade partners such as China, India, Persia and The Levant. The fall of the Melaka Empire in the 16th Century led to the art of Tekat being spread to other areas of South East Asia in particular to localities where Malay Sultans resides from Sumatera in the West to Sulawesi in the East.

Presently, there are three main traditions of Tekat – namely Peninsular Malay, Chinese Peranakan, and Indonesian Tekat traditions. The Peninsular Malay Tekat tradition is differentiated from the other two traditions by its preference for floral and geometric motifs while the Chinese Peranakan and Indonesian Tekats do include animal motifs in their designs.

In Malaysia, Peninsular Malay Tekat craft is practiced today in the states of Perak, Selangor, Pahang, Negeri Sembilan and Johor with Perak's Tekat work being generally regarded as of the highest quality. In Perak, Tekat craft industry is found all along the Perak River with the finest work being recognised to be by the artisans of Kampung Padang Changkat in Kuala Kangsar – the traditional Malay village located between the Sultan of Perak's Royal Palace, Istana Iskandariah, and the Perak River. The two most famous exponents of the Perak Tekat craft are Ahdijah Binti Hasim and Azizah Binti Mohd Yusof and their customers include the various Royal Households of Malaysia.





Presently, Tekat items are primarily used in traditional Malay ceremonies such as during weddings and Quran recitations as well as during Royal occasions such as the installation of Malay Sultans. One of the most highly regarded item is the Tepak Sireh, i.e. betel nuts and leaves ceremonial container, which is a ceremonial item that accompanies the bride and groom during a Malay wedding procession.

While on the pelamin, i.e. wedding dais where the bride and groom sits during a traditional wedding ceremony, ceremonial items may include Tekat hand-held paddle fans, Tekat decorative cushions and even a Tekat sitting mattress.

Though no longer fully clad in Tekat, there are still Malay brides and groom that choose to wear Tekat clothing on their wedding day.

Until today, Tekat is still made in the traditional way by hand where the gold or silver threads are embroidered onto velvet using a wooden frame (pemidang) as depicted via the following link:

Though maroon and red are the most popular colours - blue, purple and green are also used for Tekat works nowadays.

While in Kuala Kangsar, do check out the local traditional craft outlets for Tekat items – a truly Malaysian traditional craft as souvenirs to remember your stay in the Royal Town of Perak which is home to The Malay College Kuala Kangsar.

“We are proud of Malay College”: that was the general sentiment among the old boys, parents, teachers, and the Petronas staff after the awesomely-splendid concert the Malay College Wind Orchestra performed during the second Royal Command Performance in the magnificent Petronas Philharmonic Hall last November. It was a fitting belated birthday present for His Royal Highness Sultan Nazrin Shah who was our main guest, with Her Royal Highness Raja Permaisuri Zara Salim also in attendance.

In that particular concert, the White Knights – the name the MCKK orchestra boys called themselves – played eight songs altogether. They started with “Kota Melaka”, a Malay classical piece, and ending with the spaghetti western “Magnificent Seven” with great aplomb, before completing a memorable night performing Bob Geldof’s “We are the World” together with guest orchestra ensembles from Kolej Tunku Kurshiah and Kolej Yayasan Saad.

In the previous year, the first Royal Command Performance was staged in our own Tun Abdul Razak Auditorium. That concert, where Her Royal Highness Raja Permaisuri Zara Salim was our royal guest, was also a celebration to mark our first ever victory as the National Wind Orchestra champion, at the 17th attempt. It was then already a wonderful show, but we were not able to attract many old boys to travel three hours up to Kuala Kangsar from Klang Valley. So it was decided that the following concert would be nearer to where the audience would be. But nobody among the White Knights imagined it would be staged in the country’s most magnificent venue – the Petronas Philharmonic Hall. The news was greeted with excitement, and also with trepidation. Principal Anand announced, “we just have to ensure we raise our performance one level up to merit the privilege of performing on such a prestigious stage”.

The training began in earnest immediately after our year-end examinations. The Fifth Formers had to be exempted due to their preparations for the SPM examination. The first big task was to quickly prepare the junior musicians, some as young as Form 1, to fill that void, sufficiently. The management team had to look into all the other aspects, from transportation to accommodation, from promotions to protocol.

The performance day came a bit too quick for our comfort; we had wished we had more time to prepare. Members of the management team were also a bit restless with the slow progress of the ticket sales: who would want to book so early to watch a school outfit performing! Eventually, to borrow an often quoted phrase, “the show must go on”.

When we first stepped into the Petronas Philharmonic Hall on the morning of Tuesday, 22nd November for sound check and practice, we were taken aback by the grandeur of an international-class hall. Later when we were up standing on the stage, nervousness hit most of us. In front of us are more than 800 seats, empty at that time but will later be filled with gazing eyes and attentive ears. Straight ahead at the end, a bit elevated, is the Royal Box, very dark at that time but the segment of the audience we would want to light up once the first note is played.

We were already in our seats holding our respective musical instrument when conductor Rejab, our music instructor, walked in. After the customary royal bow to a packed hall, he turned to face us. Baton raised. At that point nothing else was in our mind, not our parents and not even

the royal guests. Looking back, at that point it was all about the following notes that we would play. We were so focused. Conductor Rejab dropped his baton, and off we went on a musical journey complementing different sounds in harmony to give life to “Kota Melaka”. The applause and cheers we received after completing “Kota Melaka” was beyond description. We knew then that we had hit the right note. We were ecstatic, but we were also calmed at the same time. When Mukhri, our own student-conductor, took over for the next song, it was plain sailing till the end of the concert.

The last piece – “We are the World” – was also well-played and well-sung among the combination of musicians from the three schools. The warm long applause that followed tried to indicate that we should play a few more numbers, but there was one last act we needed to execute perfectly. Both Royal Highnesses had consented for a big group photo on stage. We were given just three minutes to get into position, the length of time it would take the Royal Couple to leave their Royal Box and to walk up to their photography positions in the front-middle section of the stage.

To cap a really memorable night when everything went exceptionally well, the photography session also took place without the Royal Couple having to break their strides or to wait for us to get organized. Conductor Rejab and conductor Mukhri were among the few lucky ones in front to be able to shake hands with the Royal Couple. But gracefully, His Royal Highness Sultan Nazrin, clapped his hands gently and said “well done” while looking at all of us from left to right. That small but meaningful gesture was enough to make all our efforts worthwhile. It will be an experience etched in my memory that I will even share with my grandson one day.

We were still on stage talking about our joy on a mission accomplished while the crowd slowly made their way out. Principal Anand later reappeared, after he had escorted the Royal Couple to their car. He led all of us to acknowledge and applaud the hardwork put in by, firstly, the visionary Datuk Khalilur Rahman, secondly, the industrious Dato’ Ahmad Redza, thirdly the efficient Kak Balkish Khalilur Rahman. Finally, principal Anand shared with us what HRH Sultan Nazrin commented while walking to the car. The Sultan said, “We must do this again, every year”. I could immediately feel tears building up in my eyes.

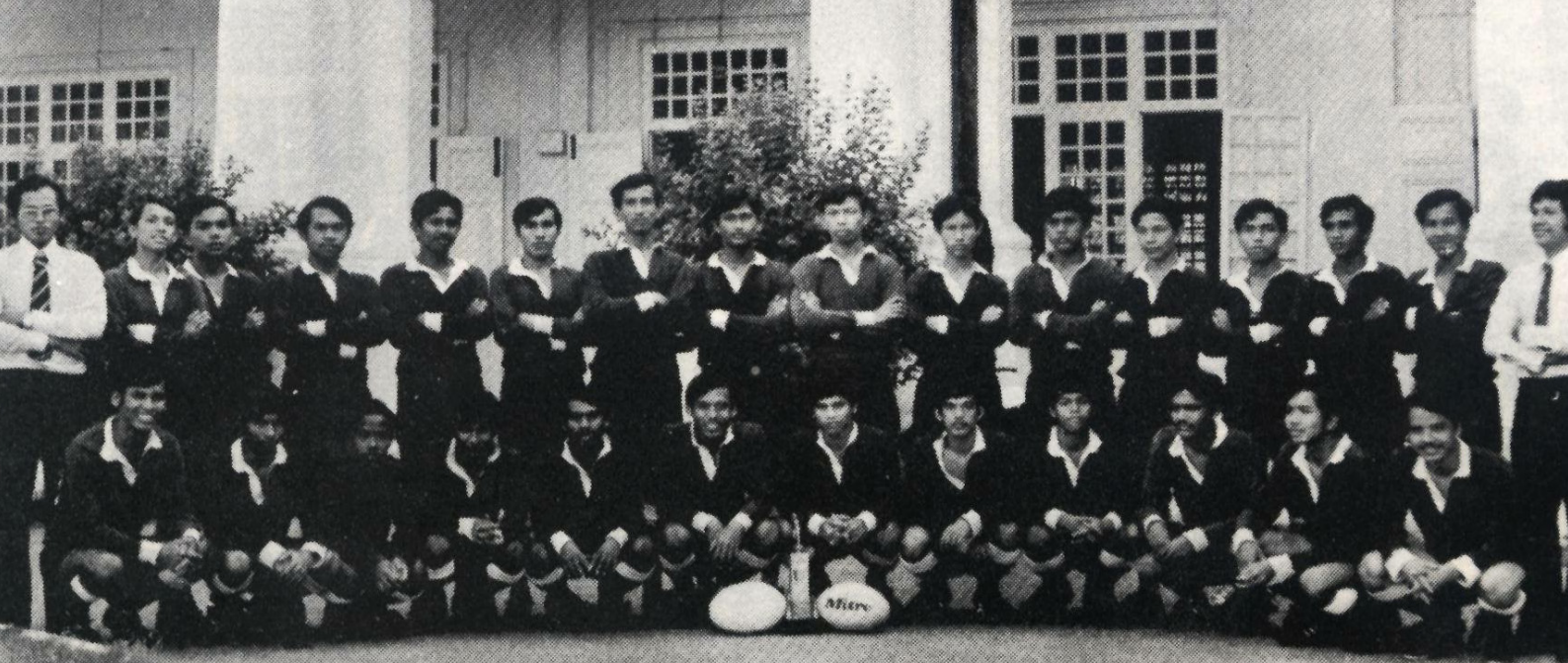
THE MALAY COLLEGE - BASTION OF MODERNITY



I went to MCKK at the age of twelve, spent the best part of my growing years until the age of seventeen and even after many years of having left it behind, felt like I have never been away from it - The Prep School, the Big Tree, Hargreaves Hall, Big School, New School, Swimming Pool and Pavilion. How can I ever forget 'Fiat Sapiencia Virtus' – Let Manliness Come Through Wisdom' – it's motto. On January 2nd 2005, MCKK was a hundred years old. The celebration of royal grandeur was set on March 26, 2005 organized by MCOBA and supported by the school and the departments of the State Government of Perak. I was there again, Alhamdulillah, to be among all those that had been there once upon a time, a boy among boys, proud of growing up in its ancient compound, walked out of its gate a man, older but not necessarily or maybe not even wiser.

MCKK began for me on a day when my excited father took me on his 'Ford Cortina' to tell the great news to my grandmother. For many-many years later, Tok would proudly tell everyone of the grandson who went to the 'great school of the royals and leaders'; introduction that often had me squirming with embarrassment. I was amused with the special attention I was getting; all the preparation - the shopping for white baju melayu, white school uniform and white pillow cases and bed sheets and white 'kelambu'. I was too young to understand that





it would soon become my new home far away from home and much more. And I would be spending and sharing my life with total strangers from all over the country. Now, I think I must have been smart lad then. With a 5A in the Penilaian Darjah 5 and being top student in Standard six of a renowned primary school Alor Star, I must say I was a bit optimistic but having later found out that almost all others also went in with 5A's. I was the first in the family to go to a full boarding school and my sister went to Tunku Khursiah College two years later. My father used to be the Head Hostel Prefect of the local day school, the Sultan Abdul Hamid College (SAHC) in the 50's. Never really understood the meaning of boarding but I knew that I had to be away from the family. I was too young to understand its significance and despite my seemingly studious nature, I was lazy to boot and spent more time reading Enid Blyton's books and scribbling away.

MCKK was to me so much more sophisticated than any environment I had previously known. There, beginning with the regal but squeaky floor boarded Prep School, I had learnt to live among boys of the same age; experienced living in a world of lights out, took shower by piped water in cubicles without doors and do that 'big' thing in a flush toilet. It was to me a whole 'brave new world'. I am no exaggerating but the world I left behind was still a world of 'Chek', 'Hang', 'Hampa', 'Depa' and then I am now in a place of 'foreign' vernacular tongues like 'Mike', 'Deme', 'Kome' and 'Yob'. Add to that the other dialects spoken by my newly acquired friends, you are lost in the lingua franca complications.

MCKK was novelty in every sense. MCKK too was a cradle for everything 'Malay'ness. This include wearing Baju Melayu with sarong and songkok every night, full baju melayu with 'sampin' on Friday and 'BRU' nights, and Baju Melayu with the maroon blazer for the prefects. Etiquette was paramount. We were told to match our shoes with our dress. When you wear Baju Melayu you can wear slippers, but put on a sampin and you must wear proper shoes. Nothing is less important than which fork

and spoon you use. Etiquette is the science of living. It embraces everything. It is ethics. It is honor.

Yet it too was a cradle for personal independence, or brotherly interdependence depending on which way you look at it. A brotherly spirit translated into a special lasting kinship of the old school tie as old boys. Those five years of learning everything or nothing (also depending on which way you look at it) made us leaders in our own way; vocal, bold and confident to the point of snobbishness. We became the prominent sore thumb in the emerging boarding schools citizenry not so much for the way we carry ourselves but just by being a 'budak koleq'. If even we were snubbed, we were what we were. We put our heart and soul in everything we do. We cried when we lost and we belittle others when we won. From the fringe of the playing fields or the halls whenever we won, we stood proudly to sing our school anthem against the jeering from the losers. And then came our turn to turn on our brand of the jeers. For the arch rival from Ipoh, the STARians we have the sweet 'Twinkle, twinkle little Star...' For standard fare, it's 'Bung Wak, Bung Wek Wek, Bung Kak Bung Kek Kek. Who are we? Malay College. Wah!'

There's no escaping its tentacles once you leave the Malay College. The Malay College, then, is more club than launch pad, a lifelong association rather than a one-off experience. It is the little black book, the A to Z that enables you to find your way when the lectures have stopped, and you've left behind the dorms, the playing fields or the hallowed corridors. With each event you attend or establishment you visit, your connection with the old place is confirmed - and so is your sense of self. You are, after all, not only what you do and who you know, but where you spent the best five, six or seven years of your life. He can feel the beat of rhythm about the ties that bind the binding heart and soul... a mystery of sweet mystery... of friendship, camaraderie and love.

TOURNAMENT RULES & 2016 RECAP



MCKK PREMIER 7s 2017 TOURNAMENT RULES

1. COMPETITION FORMAT

- a. **The tournament will be a twenty four (24) team event.**
- b. **The teams will be divided into six (6) groups of four (4) teams each.**
- c. **Preliminary Round**
 - i. Teams in the respective groups will play a round-robin format within their groups. Each team shall play three (3) matches against teams in their groups
 - a. If two (2) or more teams in the same group finish with the same number of points, the following shall determine the placing in the group.
 - b. The team with the greater point difference (points for, less points against) shall be declared the winner.
 - c. If a decision is still not reached, then the total points derived through tries, goals and penalties by each team shall be considered, priority being given in that order. Hence the team that scored more of its points through tries shall be declared the winner over a team that scored less tries. If there should be a further tie, then the number of goals shall be considered and so on, in the stated order.
 - d. If a decision is still not reached, the qualifying order shall be determined by the drawing of lots.
 - ii. If any team gives a walkover in the Group matches, all their games will be deemed null and void. They will be placed last in their group irrespective of the results of their other matches.
- d. **Quarter-Final Round**

After the Group matches,

 - i. Champions of each groups will be ranked 1st to 6th
 - ii. Second placed teams will be ranked 7th to 12th
 - iii. Third placed teams will be ranked 13th to 18th
 - iv. Fourth placed teams will be ranked 19th to 24th

Then,

 - i. Teams ranked 1st to 8th will advance to the Quarter-finals for the Cup and Plate pools. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
 - ii. Teams ranked 9th to 16th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Bowl pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
 - iii. Teams ranked 17th to 24th will proceed to the Quarter - Finals for the Shield pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- e. **Semi-final Round**
 - i. The winners of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will advance to the semi- finals of the CUP Championship.
 - ii. The losers of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will proceed to the semi- finals of the PLATE Championship.
 - iii. The winners of the Bowl quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the BOWL Championship.
 - iv. The winners of the Shield quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the SHIELD Championship.
 - v. The losers of BOTH the Bowl AND Shield quarter-finals are eliminated.
- f. **Finals**

Winners of all of the semi-finals will advance to the finals of their respective pools.

2. REGISTRATION

- a. All teams are to submit their Team Registration Form giving the final list of Twelve (12) players in their squad and their officials to the Tournament Director at the Manager's Meeting on the **24 FEBRUARY 2017**.
- b. Teams/Schools are allowed to register only their **currently** registered students, born in **2000** or later as players.
- c. During the tournament, Team Managers must register their team playing list with the Tournament Director, at the Tournament Control Centre at the field, no less than thirty (30) minutes before the commencement of their match.
- d. All Team Managers must personally register their team, with the full names of their players as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- e. Any late entries and proposed registration after the official registration deadline as in Rule 2 (c) will not be entertained, unless with prior consent of the Tournament Director.
- f. All teams must register a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of twelve (12) players upon submission of their team playing lists. No additional registration, transfer, replacement or change of team members will be permitted after the close of registration as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- g. In the event that, due to injuries, a team is unable to field a full complement of players derived from its own squad of twelve (12) registered players, such team may borrow no more than two (2) substitute players from any other team that has been eliminated from the Tournament. However, such players to be replaced have to be certified unfit to play by the Tournament Medical Officer.

A team that borrows a player or players must take the field with all their own available and uninjured players before using the replacement players. Such substitute players must be registered with the Tournament Director and can play subject to their new team using all their players first; these substitute players shall not be permitted to represent any other team during the remaining rounds of the Tournament.

3. PENALTIES

- a. Any team that plays with an unregistered player at any time during the Tournament shall forfeit their game.
- b. Any team that fields less than five (5) players in their scheduled game shall forfeit that game.

4. REPORTING TIMES

- a. All teams must be at the field-side five (5) minutes before the scheduled kick-off of each of their games.
- b. Any team that does not field a complete team as in Rule (3) above, five (5) minutes after scheduled kick-off, will forfeit their game, provided their opposing team is on the field.
- c. If both opposing teams fail to report to the Referee on the field of play five (5) minutes after the scheduled kick-off, both teams will forfeit their game.

All team captains / managers must register the names of their own seven (7) playing members for a game at the Tournament Control Centre thirty (30) minutes before commencement of the game. Additional registration forms are available from the Tournament Control Centre. It is the responsibility of Team Managers to ensure that teams obtain these forms.

5. REPLACEMENTS

Five (5) substitute players are allowed for each game. The substitute player must report to the match official at the half way line and the player to be replaced must leave the field and report to the match official before the substitute player is released onto the field.

Rolling substitutions are not allowed at any time during a game. If a player is substituted, that player must not return and play in that match even to replace an injured player.

Exception: A substituted player may replace a player with a bleeding or open wound.

6. PLAYING TIME

- a. All matches except the **CUP Final** shall be played in two (2) halves of seven (7) minutes each way with a one (1) minute interval between halves. The **CUP Final** will be played in two (2) halves of ten (10) minutes each way with a two (2) minute interval between halves.
- b. Preliminary Round - The preliminary round will be played on a round-robin basis. The score will stand at the end of regulation time. There will be no extra time for matches ending in a draw.
- c. Quarter-final, Semi-final and Final Rounds.
 - i. All matches at these stages will be played on a knock-out basis. Should a match result in a draw at the end of regulation time, extra time will be played.
 - ii. Such extra time shall consist of periods of five (5) minutes "sudden death" play-off. There will be no break in between the periods and teams will change ends immediately. The team which first kicked-off the match will do so again in the "sudden death" extra-time.
 - iii. The "sudden-death" rule shall apply as follows. The first team to score during extra time will be declared the winner and the game will end.
 - iv. In the event of still no winner, "sudden death" penalty drop-kicks of up to three (3) kickers each team will be applied.

If a decision is still not reached, the winner shall be ultimately determined by the toss of coin.

7. AWARDING OF POINTS - PRELIMINARY ROUND

Points will be awarded as follows:

- WIN - Three (3) Points**
- DRAW - One (1) Point**
- WALKOVER - Three (3) Points**
- LOSS - Zero (0) Points**

8. OFFICIAL PLAYING RULES

The Tournament By-Laws are based on the World Rugby (WR) By-Laws with seven-a-side variations of the game as adopted by the Malaysian Rugby. These by-laws will apply throughout the tournament, except the following:-

The number of players in the team will be seven (7). The number of players required in a scrum is three (3).

Sin Bin: If a player is sent to the "Sin - Bin" by the referee he must proceed immediately to the designated position at the Referees' Control Stand. He must remain stationary there for a period of two (2) mins. Only when present at the Referees' Control Stand will the period of two (2) minutes commence. Only the referee may authorise a return to play after a "Sin - Bin" period and only at the next stoppage.

9. TECHNICAL ZONE PROTOCOL

The Technical Zone Protocol as introduced by the IRB in May 2006 will be implemented during this Tournament.

- Each Team is allowed to have the following personnel in the Technical Zone during their Matches: Coach, Team Manager, Physiotherapist and five reserve Players. One additional person who is either a medical or a coaching member of the Team and whose responsibility has previously been notified to the Tournament Director.
- No additional people are allowed in the Technical Zone.
- The medical personnel in the Technical Zone may enter the field of play in accordance with Law at any time a player is injured.
- Water carriers may only take water onto the field during stoppages in play for injuries in the playing area and when a try has been scored and at no other times.
- Water carriers must remain in the Technical Zone except when providing water as detailed above.
- Water bottles must not be thrown onto the field.

- All personnel in the Technical Zone must wear a bib / vest for identification purposes and must not wear a shirt similar in colour to their team.
- The fourth official will manage the Technical Zone and will report any indiscretion to the match referee. The match referee may caution the offender or expel them from the playing enclosure. Any offender may be reported to the Disciplinary Committee for investigation and further action.
- Replacement players and all other team officials other than those in the Technical Zone must remain seated on the replacement bench.
- Replacement players are only allowed to warm up before they enter the field in a designated place set further back from the field of play than the replacement bench.

10. HOME & AWAY TEAMS

These terms are used in a game should there be a clash of jersey colours. In this situation, the "HOME" team shall have to change its jerseys to a set of acceptable colour.

11. PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted in writing through Team Managers to the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game during which the matter of the protest occurred. Verbal protests will not be entertained. A protest must be submitted together with a deposit of RM100. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. Should the protest be overruled, the deposit will be forfeited.

12. APPEAL & DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- a. This Committee shall hear all appeals and decide on disciplinary action for the duration of the Tournament. The Tournament Director shall be co-opted at any hearing of the Committee but shall have no vote.
- b. Players or Team Officials reported for misconduct or sent off the field shall have their cases considered as soon as possible by the Committee.
- c. Any player who is sent off the field shall be automatically suspended for one (1) game and the Committee shall determine his further participation in the Tournament.
- d. Any player that receives more than one (1) Yellow card in the Tournament shall be automatically suspended for the subsequent game. The Committee shall determine his further participation in the tournament.
- e. The quorum for the meeting of this Committee shall be three (4) members:
 - a) **Tournament Director (Co-opted)**
 - b) **Technical Director**
 - c) **2 Independent Team Managers**

Disciplinary action taken by the Committee shall only apply for the duration of the Tournament. The Committee shall report the actions taken to relevant bodies for any further review.

13. INTERPRETATION OF TOURNAMENT RULES

The Organising Committee reserves the right of interpretation in the case of doubts arising from the wording of any rule. It shall also have the right to decide on any situation that is not covered by the rules and such decision shall be final.

14. TROPHY OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY

- a. The NJ Ryan Trophy (Tournament Trophy) remains the property of MCKK/MCOBA and cannot be won outright.
- b. The winning team shall receive the Trophy and a replica, but will have to return the Trophy to the Organising Committee before they depart for home.

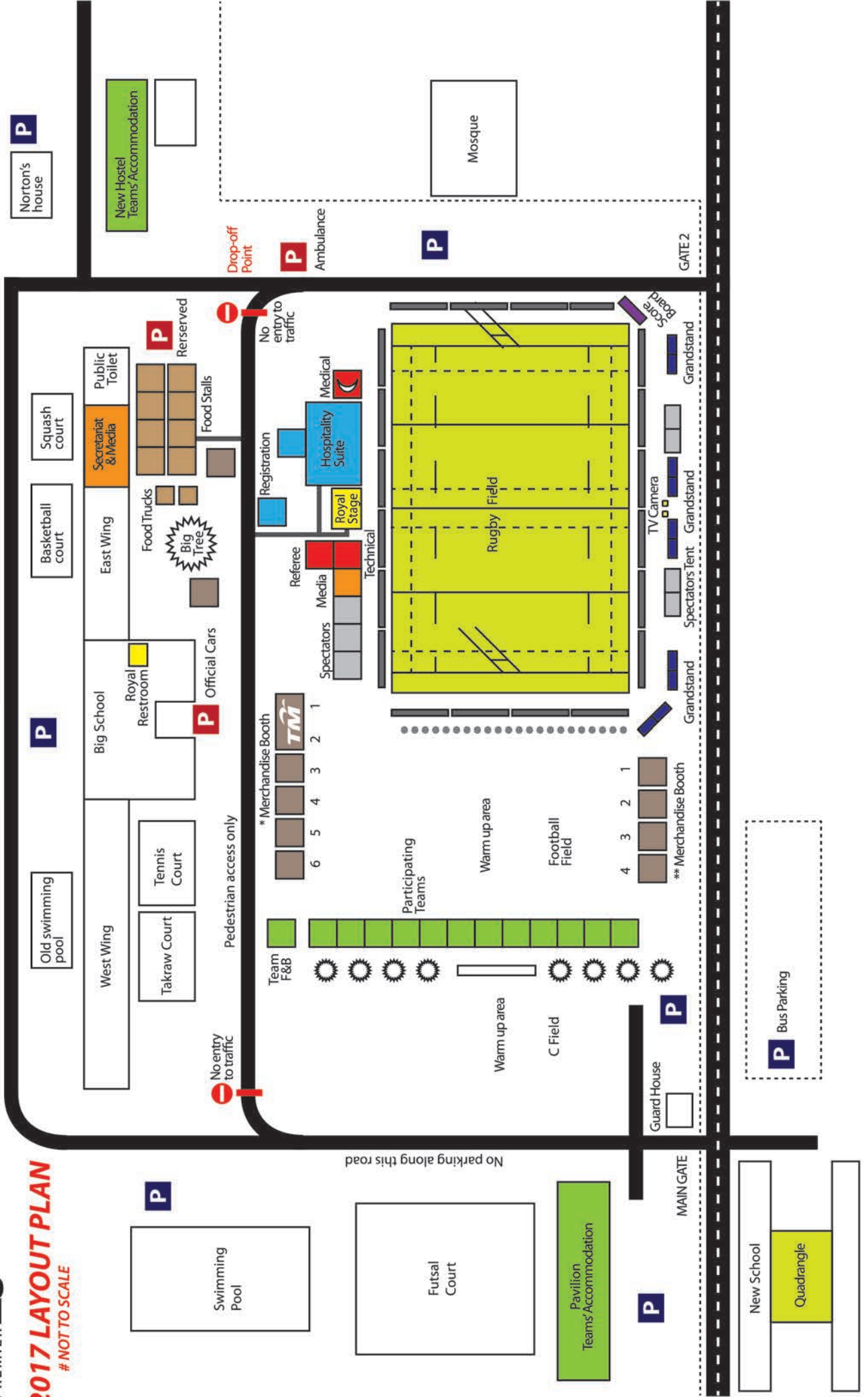
