The King's Pavilion of Kuala Kangsar

On a knoll besides the Kangsar River, just across from Kuala Kangsar Town, there is a hundred year old building which formerly hosted the primary school of The Malay College Kuala Kangsar (MCKK). The building, designed in the Victorian revival style of classical architecture, was originally the Residency of the British High Commissioner to the Federated Malay States (FMS) and hence was known as The King's Pavilion of Kuala Kangsar.

Sir John Anderson, the British High Commissioner (1904–1911), was responsible for the construction of the King's Pavilion while Mr Arthur Benison Hubback, the then Architectural Assistant to the Director of Public Works Department (PWD) of the Federated Malay States was the architect in charge of the project. Mr Hubbard had also designed MCKK's Big School and Prep School buildings as well as other prominent buildings at the turn of the 20th century such as Kuala Kangsar's Masjid Ubudiah, Ipoh's Railway Station and Kuala Lumpur's Municipal Office and Town Hall as well as its General Post Office, Railway Station and Masjid Jamek.

Construction of the King's Pavilion started in 1905 and took two years to complete. Upon its completion in 1907, it hosted many an official function whenever the High Commissioner is in town for the next forty years or so ... However, the Second World War (WWII) changed the British Empire forever - the King's Pavilion of Kuala Kangsar included.

During the War, the King's Pavilion was taken over by the Japanese Army for both administrative and "other" purposes. Post-WWII, the British Military Administration accordingly took control of the King's Pavilion. However, political developments in Britain and in the then Malaya resulted in the premises not being used as the Residence of the High Commissioner again.

During the Conference of Rulers, held on 31st August 1948, the Malay Rulers expressed their wish for MCKK to be expanded in terms of its capacity to take in additional students and that



the King's Pavilion to be taken over by MCKK so as to provide additional classrooms and dormitories. In 1950, the King's Pavilion accordingly became a part of MCKK hosting its newly created primary school arm.

During this period of its existence, a notable resident of The King's Pavilion was one Mr J. A. B. Wilson who later became a world famous novelist who published under the name Anthony Burgess which is actually his second and third Christian names. Amongst his more famous works are A Clockwork Orange and The Malayan Trilogy. The first novel of the Malayan Trilogy, Time For A Tiger, was actually his first published novel of fiction and it is widely accepted that the said work was loosely based on his experiences in Kuala Kangsar.

Here is an excerpt from Anthony Burgess' 1987 autobiography - Little Wilson and Big God :

"It was beautiful enough; an ample structure of Victorian age, and the view from its verandas was sumptuous. It looked down on great trees and gardens ... beyond was the confluence of rivers; beyond again the jungle and the mountains. But the gorgeousness of the vista was inadequate payment for the responsibility imposed on us. We inhabited what was in effect a huge flat, cut off, but not cut off enough, from the classrooms and dormitories of the school. At the beginning of the school year weeping Malay boys would arrive


with their mothers and fathers, who would stay a night with them and try to stay more, and prepare to be turned into sophisticated collegians. They know no English, and this had to be taught by Mr Gawthorne and Mrs Vivekananda. When lessons were over they made much noise ... I had to harangue these young boys in good idiomatic Malay and, though I was learning fast, I was not able to learn it fast enough".

MCKK's primary classes were discontinued in 1957 and as the distance between MCKK's main campus and the King's Pavilion campus being logistically challenging, it was decided to return King's Pavilion to the Government. In 1961, the King's Pavilion was accordingly handed over to the State Education Department to be used by the then Government English Girls School (GEGS) in exchange for, amongst others, land then hosting the GEGS campus located adjacent to MCKK's main campus. Subsequently, GEGS was renamed Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Raja Perempuan Kelsom.

Should you have the time while in Kuala Kangsar, do visit the historical SMK Raja Perempuan Kelsom which is occupying the building formerly known as the King's Pavilion of Kuala Kangsar.

MCKK World Scholar's Cup: Our Journey to Success

"We never thought we would get this far."

Back in 2016, Adlan Haziq, then a Fourth Former, did well enough to qualify from the Penang Local Round of the World Scholar's Cup (WSC) to compete in the Bangkok Regional Round and returned with 1 gold and 2 silver medals. Although Adlan, whom many old boys would remember as the impressive Form 1 boy who spoke in the auditorium on the day we celebrated Prep School's centenary, did not qualify for the penultimate Global Round, he at least had paved the way for the 2018 team.

The WSC is perhaps the most prestigious and challenging global co-academic competition, involving multiple events that are based on a specific syllabus across six subjects, namely Science and Technology, Art and Music, Social Studies, Literature, History and Special Areas. The competition comprises of four sections: Team Debate, Essay Writing, Team Quiz and Individual Test. The questions and debate motions revolve around an annual theme. The theme for 2018 was "An Entangled World". We, like most other ignorant teenagers, were dumbfounded at first. Slowly, after studying the syllabus, we began to understand the complexities that man create that have turned our world into "An Entangled World"; serious heavy stuff.

Early in 2018, Muhammad Luqman Nawar, MCKK top English Language debater even only at Form 4, asked Ms Sharifah: "Why don't we try to reach the WSC Global Tournament of Champions at Yale University?" From then on, the real journey began.

Lugman's first task was to successfully convince five others so that MCKK can submit two teams of three members each. Ahmad Adam (F4), Alif Daniel (F4), Faiz Syafie (F4), Hilman Irfan (F3) and Mikhail Taufiq (F2) were roped in. With the Penang Local Round only a few weeks away, an intensive training was necessary. We organized daily discussions regarding the six WSC subjects and held mock debates to prepare for Penang as best as we could. Our efforts on that 31st March 2018 were rewarded with 21 gold and 24 silver medals collectively (no bronze medals are awarded in WSC). We have exceeded our own expectations and the great news was that all six of us have qualified for the Regional Round in Melbourne, Australia.

Melbourne was to be in mid-August. With a lot of things on our plate such as orchestra training, PPM debate preparation and other commitments as well as our studies, we had to find a way to deal with all those. Our beloved Ms Sharifah decided that it would be a strategic approach to do extensive research on the topics and create booklets on each subject. Equipped better than before, we headed for Melbourne in solidarity, brotherhood and passion.

The Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre (MCEC) was the venue for the Regional Round. This time, we were facing tougher competition so we had to double our efforts studying and debating better than before. Our efforts paid off as our medal haul doubled! We bagged in total 48 gold and 16 silver medals! For the first time ever, MCKK will be represented in the penultimate round – the Global Tournament of Champions at Yale University, USA. More good news, all six of us and both teams will travel to New Haven.

Knowing that this round was the ultimate, we had to prove to everyone that all our sacrifices and hard work will keep the college flag soaring high. Being an expensive trip, we had to make it worthwhile for ourselves and to not let people down. We improved our flawed booklets with additional highlights and notes so the syllabus would be at the tip of our fingers. We were given

some time off from school to prepare ourselves. Days passed and eventually we were on our 25-hour journey to Yale!

After a 2-hour drive into New Haven from JFK Airport, we just collapsed in our Airbnb. Snow greeted us the next morning in November. After a brief snowball battle in the courtyard, hard work began in earnest. Despite a very long tiring trip and only one day of revision, the global finals commenced. Facing extremely difficult questions, debating topics and excellent rival students, we were committed to do our best. When the results came out, we were exuberant hauling 14 gold and 30 silver medals, and these at the penultimate global stage. We were over the moon to say the least.

All in all, the overall World Scholars Cup experience was one that made us more humble, more disciplined and a lot more knowledgeable by the end. A journey that took 9 months not only convinced us to believe that "success is not impossible" but also moulded a valuable relationship between us that would stand the test of time.

This wouldn't have been possible without the help, encouragement and support from Ms. Sharifah, our teacher advisor, Mr. Anand, our headmaster, sponsors for the trip from PIBG, MCKK Foundation, members of the Board of Governors and our parents. Not to forget the emotional support and prayers from all college boys and teachers.

We end with a note from our headmaster. HM Anand is contented to note that here in Kuala Kangsar, we have done and we are doing the right things to mould and produce these fine young gentlemen who are on par with other exceptionally talented students from top institutions globally. 



Zaharuddin Alias

Zaharuddin Alias, who played first team football and rugby for the Malay College in the early 70s, succumbed to pancreatic cancer last November. His batch-mate in school and team-mate in the MCOBA rugby team, Aziz Hassan, recalls the brilliance that was Zaha on every field he stepped onto.

No one in Malaysian rugby was more skilful than Zaha during his era.

He was the kind of talent that surfaced once every many years and his abilities on the sports field shone from the time the boys were in Prep School at the age of 13.

Zaha, as he was widely known, wasn't one of the bigger or taller boys but his sublime skills in football and rugby meant that he could get past his markers effortlessly.

Rugby was new to probably all of the 86 innocent kids at the 1966 Prep School but even here Zaha was already displaying his side-stepping skills that were such a delight to watch and left those who thought they could tackle him bewildered. That he more like glided as he ran upfield made it all the more special, in the process hardly breaking his strides.

Zaha made it to the football First XI in 1970 as a 17-year-old and stayed there as the chief striker for the next three years but rugby was something he decided to be involved more seriously on making the First XV from lower six.

Old boys first noticed his skills as an inside centre during the annual school versus old boys game in 1972, in a year the students approached the game determined to knock the old boys off. A few boasted that they were going to play like the French, who in those days were famous for the way they attacked from all parts of the field as they chucked the ball around in an unconventional way.

The First XV beat the Old Boys alright, with Zaha's sidesteps the main talking point after the game.

The skills Zaha had were to shine again a few months later during the two games the First XV

played on two consecutive days at the University of Malaya ground a week before their trip to Bangkok for the annual match against Vajiravudh College. The university boys on the sidelines remarked that this was one boy they wanted in their team the following year, a wish that came true because Zaha was a student there from 1973 to 1976, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts upper second class honours.

After graduation he played club rugby for Club X, which later became Anchorman. Zaha was comfortable at playing both positions in the midfield. Tackling was his other strong point and you couldn't recall too many instances when he missed a tackle. Everyone was brought down, including the Kiwis and Polynesian types playing for the Singapore-based New Zealand Forces and those guys were no doubt big and strong.

From club rugby Zaha progressed to play for the Selangor state team and later the national team, participating also in the Hong Kong Sevens and Asian Rugby Championship. This was simply a natural progression for such a player and I have often wondered what he would have been like had he played his rugby in New Zealand, England or Wales, for example.

Playing for MCOBA could have cost him a place in the state and national teams but he took that chance for the love of the school.

There was though a slight hiccup in his playing career when Zaha agreed to be part of the pioneering MCKK Old Boys team formed in 1977 on the initiative of old boy Azizan Abbas (Class of 1964; MCKK First XV 1963/64).

Soon after his transfer as a Customs officer from Penang to Kuala Lumpur, Azizan came to see me at the Malay Mail to ask if I could assist to start a MCOBA team, which I agreed without hesitation. The first player I talked to was Zaha, to whom I said "there will be no MCOBA team without you". Maybe that was a bit unfair considering that he was playing in the senior division and a new team like MCOBA would only be accepted into

the second division. And playing in the lower division could affect his place in the state and national teams but Zaha too agreed without reservations. The state and national selectors however could not ignore a player of his calibre and duly selected him as a first choice.

What cut short Zaha's career was a knee ligament damage that the doctors told him after surgery was among the worst they had seen.

Malay Collegians from the mid-60s to early 70s especially, old boys who had seen him play and his mates in the teams he played for have only fond memories and sincere appreciation for the good times Zaha brought to the sport.

Note:

1 – Zaha was also the MCKK deputy headboy in 1972 and together with headboy Ikmal Hijaz Hashim (Datuk) and three other Malaysians participated in the three-month World Campus Afloat programme from October 1971 organised by California's Chapman College on board the Queen Elizabeth 2 vessel. Apart from Malaysia, there were five students each from Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong and Singapore representing Asia.

2 – Mcob Wan Zulkifli Wan Yusof (Class of 74) and the owner of Keloil Sdn. Bhd., himself an outstanding footballer who also played rugby, is donating a trophy for the Best Malaysian Player of the MCKK P7s, to be named in honour of Zaha with the consent of his family.

REMINISCING CORNER:

The Formation Of MCOBA

MCOBA 901 1929 - 2019

An alumni association such as MCOBA (Malay College Old Boys Association) is an association of graduates or, more broadly, of former students (alumni) of an educational institution. These associations often organise social or sports events, network, publish newsletters or magazines, and raise funds for the organisation. Alumni associations are mainly organised around universities or schools, but may also be organised among students that studied in a certain country. In the past, they were often considered to be the university's or school's old boy society (or old boys network). Today, alumni associations involve graduates of all age groups and demographics.

Perhaps, one of the important events in the annals of MCOBA occurred in 1929. It was the year that the Malay College Old Boys Association was formed. It was formed after a gathering of old boys for what is known as the Old Boys Weekend. The following account of their gathering as reported from March edition of the "Times of Malaya" and the "Planters & Miners Gazette".

"...Kuala Kangsar, which is usually a quiet town, compared to its neighbours, Taiping or Ipoh, and which enjoys a quiet sleep on the seventh day of the week was wide awake on Sunday last and on all hands there were signs of new faces and festivity. The reason for this change in the otherwise normal existence of this pretty town in Perak was the decision which prompted the old boys of the Malay College, twenty-four years after its birth, to foregather at their Alma Mater to discuss the formation of, and bring into being an Old Boys' Association.

There were about 150 past students of the College who had come to Kuala Kangsar from all parts of the Malay Peninsula as was broadcast by the number-plates on the numerous cars that swelled the traffic. The magnificent building which houses the Malay College and the land on which it stands were both gaily decorated, all pointing to the fact that it was the 'Hari Besar' of the Old Boys.

A happy atmosphere prevailed and such must be the case when schoolmates who parted eighteen to twenty years ago at the College gates after completion of the education which has sent them out to the world, meet each other, in several cases for the first time. Unforgettable incidents in their school days were recalled, notes were compared as to how they progressed after leaving school, the older boys were introduced to comparatively recent colleagues and stories were narrated by the more fortunate to them who had gone to England to finish their education and come back to enter the Malaysn Civil Service. Thus was the time spent till about 10 a.m. when they all gathered in the school hall to discuss and unanimously adopt the resolution which was to give birth to the Old Boys' Association.

After spending the best part of Sunday morning in discussing the pros and cons of an Old Boys' Association, the gathering adopted a more public aspect when the Old Boys were "At-home" before a football match between the Old Boys from the North of Malaya and the South, for a handsome silver cup by that king of Malayan Sportsman, His Highness the Sultan of Perak, whose inability to take part in the day's celebrations was sincerely regretted by all those present.

Tea was served in the dining room and here were gathered nearly two hundred people including the Honourable British Resident of Perak, The Honourable the Raja di Hilir, the District Officer, Mr.T.S. Adams, Mr.Bazell, the headmaster, and several others. The Raja Muda of Perak presided over all the various functions.

After tea an adjournment was made to the ground of the school where the football match was witnessed by even a larger crowd. The match over, the hosts and guests went to their various homes to prepare for the dinner which was held at the College at 8.00 p.m. About 150 people stayed to an excellent banquet, while the State Band, which was in attendance throughout the day, provided the music. The menu was as follows;

Hors d'oeuvre, Tomato Soup, Salmon with Mayonnaise Sauce, Cold Ox- tongued and Salad, Nasi Briani, Mutton Curry, Chicken Musamah, Sambal, Asparagus, Pudding, Fruit, Coffee. There then followed a number of speeches with the Raja Muda of Perak first proposing a toast of the Malay College. He paid tribute to the Rulers of the Federated Malay States through whose support the College came into existence. He continued:

"I mention this because in the old days and even now, you will find that Malay parents are not keen on sending their children to English schools because they have an idea that the teaching of English language may corrupt their Muslim religion. It was Their Highnesses who discredited their belief ".

The Raja Muda went on to pay tribute to Mr. Wilkinson and H. Hargreaves who had been given three years to make the school a success. This success had certainly been achieved. The second speech was by Mr. Bazell, the headmaster, who said,

"I have been on a short family vacation. My ticket was looked after by an Old Boy. If I go to the hospital, either the dresser or the doctor or both are old Boys, if I make myself a nuisance I shall get arrested and run in by an Old Boy; my case is certain to come before an Old Boy magistrate and I shall brief the first Malay barrister. In fact, gentlemen, our cargo are miscellaneous and as captain of the ship at present, and filled with the spirits of the future, all this fills me with promise for your old school.

I am one of those who believe that your country can be run by you for yourselves and by yourselves.

I am looking ahead. As a matter of fact there is one sitting among you now who I hope will be the first Malay to qualify as an engineer. The future of the College is good. You have already been told that the first three years were an experiment. I have a minute by the Resident-General: "I do not think it will come to anything but I am willing to give a three year trial." Within two years \$90,000 was voted to build the boat After 24 years_the Old Boys have suddenly realised that they are the one. I accept the omen and as captain of the ship for the present, on behalf of those who made the College and ran the College, including the Old Boys, I thank you all for your wishes for the future."

The Raja di Hilir of Perak proposed the toast to the Old Boys and in part of his speech he made the following important point:

"...there is at present a very great tendency on the part of Eastern people to imitate Europe, whether what they imitate is good or bad, because they have apparently acquired a somewhat slavish mentality being overcome by the glitter of European civilisation. There is an English saying (if I remember rightly) 'that to ape is suicide'. Let us hope that the Malays will only adopt such civilisation as they can assimilate, having due regard to their own customs".

There were further speeches by Tuanku Abdul Rahman, Inche Hamzah, Raja Musa of Selangor and Raja Kamarulzaman. Raja Musa said the delay in forming an Old Boys' Association was to be regretted but the delay was not due to the natural lack of inclination but rather 'that all, or majority of those present are employed in the government service and I think I am right in saying that they imbibed the slow and cumbersome manner in which government moves..."

That worthy account of the first ever 'Old Boys's weekend' (OBW) at MCKK reported by the 'Times of Malaya 'and 'Planters Gazette' was the precursor of the formation of MCOBA which resulted into the registration of the Malay College Old Boys Association (MCOBA) later in the year 1929 with Raja Musa Raja Bot as the first President of MCOBA.

Anniversaries are celebrations of journeys. Just like MCOBA's 90th anniversary in 2019. It is a celebration of a journey that started in 1929. What a journey it had been. Through the highs and lows, MCOBA had weathered the constant variables of life. And the journey is nothing short of excellent. It about embracing the pride, inculcating the passion and living the traditions. It's also about giving back to society and the old Alma Mater. Happy 90th birthday, MCOBA!

You are nearly as old as the old man leading this country and you are still around. The worthy Nonagenarian alumni continues on. A rightful 'Nona Zaman Sekarang!' Let us celebrate this 90th anniversary with a toast remembering the blissful memories and countless moments of pride, passion and tradition.

MCKK PREMIER 75 2019 TOURNAMENT RULES

1. COMPETITION FORMAT

- a. The tournament will be a twenty four (24) team event.
- b. The teams will be divided into six (6) groups of four (4) teams each.

c. Preliminary Round

- Teams in the respective groups will play a round-robin format within their groups. Each team shall play three (3) matches against teams in their groups
 - a. If two (2) or more teams in the same group finish with the same number of points, the following shall determine the placing in the group.
 - b. The team with the greater point difference (points for, less points against) shall be declared the winner.
 - c. If a decision is still not reached, then the total points derived through tries, goals and penalties by each team shall be considered, priority being given in that order. Hence the team that scored more of its points through tries shall be declared the winner over a team that scored less tries. If there should be a further tie, then the number of goals shall be considered and so on. in the stated order.
 - If a decision is still not reached, the qualifying order shall be determined by the drawing of lots.
- If any team gives a walkover in the Group matches, all their games will be deemed null and void. They will be placed last in their group irrespective of the results of their other matches.

d. Quarter-Final Round

After the Group matches,

- i. Champions of each groups will be ranked 1st to 6th
- ii. Second placed teams will be ranked 7th to 12th
- iii. Third placed teams will be ranked 13th to 18th
- iv. Fourth placed teams will be ranked 19th to 24th

Then,

- Teams ranked 1st to 8th will advance to the Quarter-finals for the Cup and Plate pools. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- ii. Teams ranked 9th to 16th will proceed to the Quarter Finals for the Bowl pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.
- iii. Teams ranked 17th to 24th will proceed to the Quarter Finals for the Shield pool. The teams will play as determined by the draw.

e. Semi-final Round

- i. The winners of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will advance to the semi- finals of the CUP Championship.
- The losers of the Cup/Plate quarter-finals will proceed to the semi- finals of the PLATE Championship.
- iii. The winners of the Bowl quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the BOWL Championship.
- iv. The winners of the Shield quarter-finals will advance to the semi-finals of the SHIELD Championship.
- v. The losers of BOTH the Bowl AND Shield quarter-finals are eliminated.

f. Finals

Winners of all of the semi-finals will advance to the finals of their respective pools.

2. REGISTRATION

- All teams are to submit their Team Registration Form giving the final list of Twelve (12) players in their squad and their officials to the Tournament Director via ONLINE by the 27th FEBRUARY 2019.
- b. Teams/Schools are allowed to register only their <u>currently</u> registered students, born in 2002 or later as players.

- c. During the tournament, Team Managers must register their team playing list with the Tournament Director, at the Tournament Control Centre at the field, no less than thirty (30) minutes before the commencement of their match.
- d. All Team Managers must personally register their team, with the full names of their players as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- e. Any late entries and proposed registration after the official registration deadline as in Rule 2 (c) will not be entertained, unless with prior consent of the Tournament Director
- f. All teams must register a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of twelve (12) players upon submission of their team playing lists. No additional registration, transfer, replacement or change of team members will be permitted after the close of registration as in Rule 2 (c) above.
- g. In the event that, due to injuries, a team is unable to field a full complement of players derived from its own squad of twelve (12) registered players, such team may borrow no more than two (2) substitute players from any other team that has been eliminated from the Tournament. However, such players to be replaced have to be certified unfit to play by the Tournament Medical Officer.

A team that borrows a player or players must take the field with all their own available and uninjured players before using the replacement players. Such substitute players must be registered with the Tournament Director and can play subject to their new team using all their players first; these substitute players shall not be permitted to represent any other team during the remaining rounds of the Tournament.

3. PENALTIES

- a. Any team that plays with an unregistered player at any time during the Tournament shall forfeit their game.
- Any team that fields less than five (5) players in their scheduled game shall forfeit that game.

4. REPORTING TIMES

- All teams must be at the field-side five (5) minutes before the scheduled kick-off of each of their games.
- Any team that does not field a complete team as in Rule (3) above, five (5) minutes
 after scheduled kick-off, will forfeit their game, provided their opposing team is on
 the field
- If both opposing teams fail to report to the Referee on the field of play five (5) minutes after the scheduled kick-off, both teams will forfeit their game.

All team captains / managers must register the names of their own seven (7) playing members for a game at the Tournament Control Centre thirty (30) minutes before commencement of the game. Additional registration forms are available from the Tournament Control Centre. It is the responsibility of Team Managers to ensure that teams obtain these forms.

5. REPLACEMENTS

Five (5) substitute players are allowed for each game. The substitute player must report to the match official at the half way line and the player to be replaced must leave the field and report to the match official before the substitute player is released onto the field.

Rolling substitutions are allowed at any time during a game.

6. PLAYING TIME

a. All matches except the CUP Final shall be played in two (2) halves of seven (7) minutes each way with a one (1) minute interval between halves. The CUP Final will be played in two (2) halves of ten (10) minutes each way with a two (2) minute interval between halves.

- Preliminary Round The preliminary round will be played on a round-robin basis.
 The score will stand at the end of regulation time. There will be no extra time for matches ending in a draw.
- c. Quarter-final, Semi-final and Final Rounds.
 - All matches at these stages will be played on a knock-out basis. Should a match result in a draw at the end of regulation time, extra time will be played.
 - ii. Such extra time shall consist of periods of five (5) minutes "sudden death" play-off. There will be no break in between the periods and teams will change ends immediately. The team which first kicked-off the match will do so again in the "sudden death" extra-time.
 - iii. The "sudden-death" rule shall apply as follows. The first team to score during extra time will be declared the winner and the game will end.
 - iv. In the event of still no winner, "sudden death" penalty drop-kicks of up to three (3) kickers each team will be applied.

If a decision is still not reached, the winner shall be ultimately determined by the toss of coin

7. AWARDING OF POINTS - PRELIMINARY ROUND

Points will be awarded as follows: WIN - Three (3) Points DRAW - One (1) Point WALKOVER - Three (3) Points LOSS - Zero (0) Points

8. OFFICIAL PLAYING RULES

The Tournament By-Laws are based on the World Rugby (WR) By-Laws with seven-a-side variations of the game as adopted by the Malaysian Rugby. These by-laws will apply throughout the tournament, except the following:-

The number of players in the team will be seven (7). The number of players required in a scrum is three (3).

Sin Bin: If a player is sent to the "Sin - Bin" by the referee he must proceed immediately to the designated position at the Referees' Control Stand. He must remain stationary there for a period of two (2) mins. Only when present at the Referees' Control Stand will the period of two (2) minutes commence. Only the referee may authorise a return to play after a "Sin - Bin" period and only at the next stoppage.

9. TECHNICAL ZONE PROTOCOL

The Technical Zone Protocol as introduced by the IRB in May 2006 will be implemented during this Tournament.

- Each Team is allowed to have the following personnel in the Technical Zone during their Matches: Coach, Team Manager, Physiotherapist and five reserve Players. One additional person who is either a medical or a coaching member of the Team and whose responsibility has previously been notified to the Tournament Director.
- No additional people are allowed in the Technical Zone.
- The medical personnel in the Technical Zone may enter the field of play in accordance with Law at any time a player is injured.
- Water carriers may only take water onto the field during stoppages in play for injuries in the playing area and when a try has been scored and at no other times.
- Water carriers must remain in the Technical Zone except when providing water as detailed above.
- Water bottles must not be thrown onto the field.
- All personnel in the Technical Zone must wear a bib / vest for identification purposes and must not wear a shirt similar in colour to their team.

- The fourth official will manage the Technical Zone and will report any
 indiscretion to the match referee. The match referee may caution the offender
 or expel them from the playing enclosure. Any offender may be reported to
 the Disciplinary Committee for investigation and further action.
- Replacement players and all other team officials other than those in the Technical Zone must remain seated on the replacement bench.
- Replacement players are only allowed to warm up before they enter the field in a designated place set further back from the field of play than the replacement bench.

10. HOME & AWAY TEAMS

These terms are used in a game should there be a clash of jersey colours. In this situation, the "HOME" team shall have to change its jerseys to a set of acceptable colour.

11. PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted in writing through Team Managers to the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of the end of the game during which the matter of the protest occurred. Verbal protests will not be entertained. A protest must be submitted together with a deposit of RM100. The deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld. Should the protest be overruled, the deposit will be forfeited.

12. APPEAL & DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

- a. This Committee shall hear all appeals and decide on disciplinary action for the duration of the Tournament. The Tournament Director shall be co-opted at any hearing of the Committee but shall have no vote.
- b. Players or Team Officials reported for misconduct or sent off the field shall have their cases considered as soon as possible by the Committee.
- Any player who is sent off the field shall be automatically suspended for one (1) game and the Committee shall determine his further participation in the Tournament.
- d. Any player that receives more than one (1) Yellow card in the Tournament shall be automatically suspended for the subsequent game. The Committee shall determine his further participation in the tournament.
- e. The quorum for the meeting of this Committee shall be three (4) members:
 - a) Tournament Director (Co-opted)
 - b) Technical Director
 - c) 2 Independent Team Managers

Disciplinary action taken by the Committee shall only apply for the duration of the Tournament. The Committee shall report the actions taken to relevant bodies for any further review.


13. INTERPRETATION OF TOURNAMENT RULES




